

Where to? What next?



With spirits elevating to the sky these sophomores work and play together with an enthusiasm and shimmer that makes them genuinely "Priceless Pearls."



The "Whirl" Goes Round and Round


With spirits as high as their ideals, these "Junior Jets" whirled their way to the top.

The most electrifying meet was with Mepham when Bay Shore trounced the team for the first time in twenty years.




In the Long Island meet in which Bay Shore placed fourth the only person, other than Guy,





The ubiquitous Mr. Joseph also won the century at the Island meet and placed second in the State. Since most of the team were juniors, Mr. Hotaling and Mr. Martin hope that next year's record will be equally good.
