Most important to us, you have been our friend. We would therefore like to dedicate the 1962 Maroon and White to you, our friend, Warde G. McLaughlin.



The girl turns and leaves the window.


III. Below, the garbage cans encroaching on the sidewalk cast shadows against the aged stone that once had sparkle in it but recently had grown bored of being ostentatious.


There is little traffic on the street, no cars parked.
