




A world asleep—all white and glistening and beautiful. This is the winter.


SPRING





VARSITY FOOTBALL






This year's team was basically a hard playing club and definitely better than its record states, but the loss of a game always takes something out of the players.

The outstanding play of Rocco Damoto won him a place on the All-League team, while Wally Haug and Tom Brummerloh received honorable mention.


