In respect and admiration for him as a man, as an administrator, and as our friend, we dedicate the Maroon and White to our genial giant, Mr. William B. Thieben.



Most of all, by just being themselves, devotedly and unstintingly, they made a place in our hearts that shall always be young.

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

Next year's team will have a fine crop of underclassmen and can expect a good season.


