In respect and admiration for him as a man, as an administrator, and as our friend, we dedicate the Maroon and White to our genial giant, Mr. William B. Thieben.



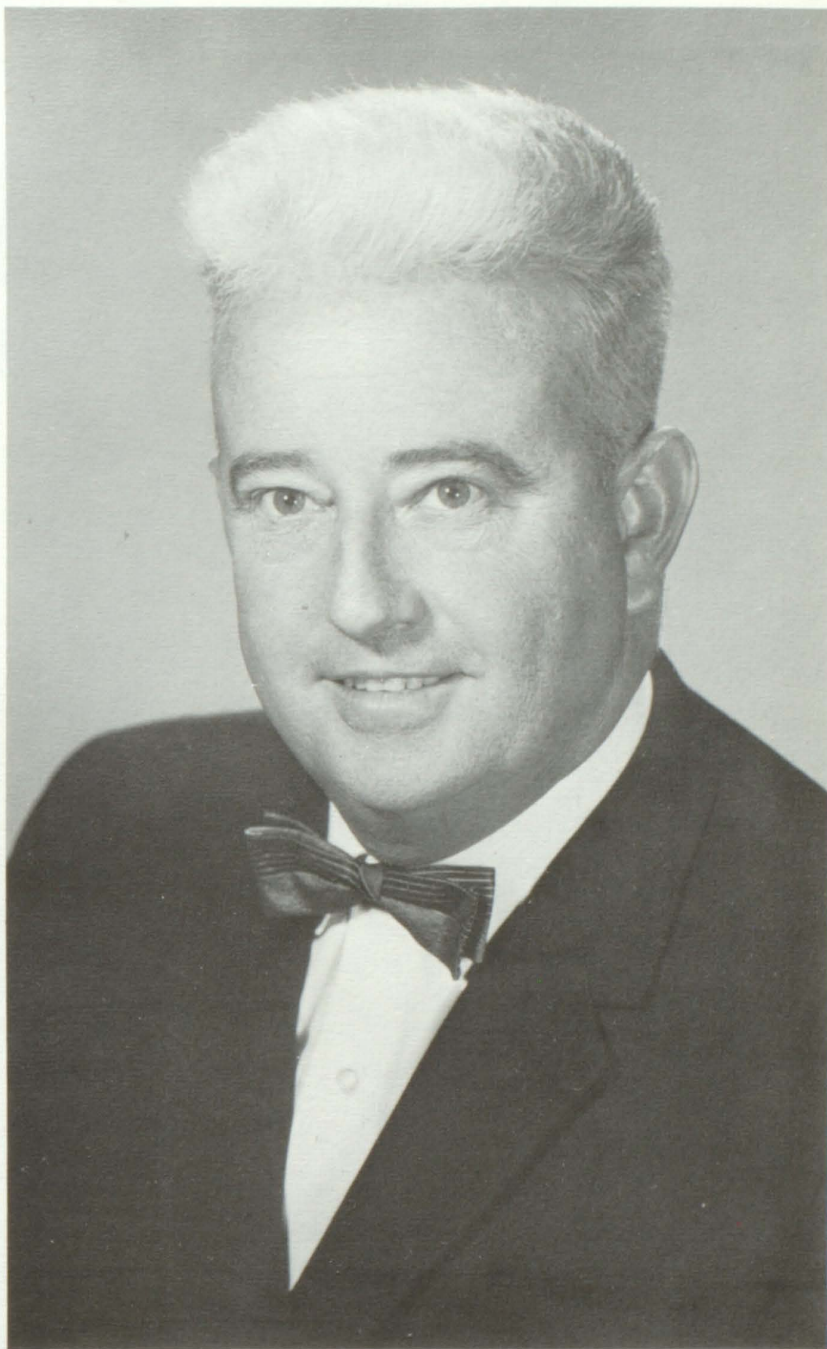

Next year's team will have a fine crop of underclassmen and can expect a good season.

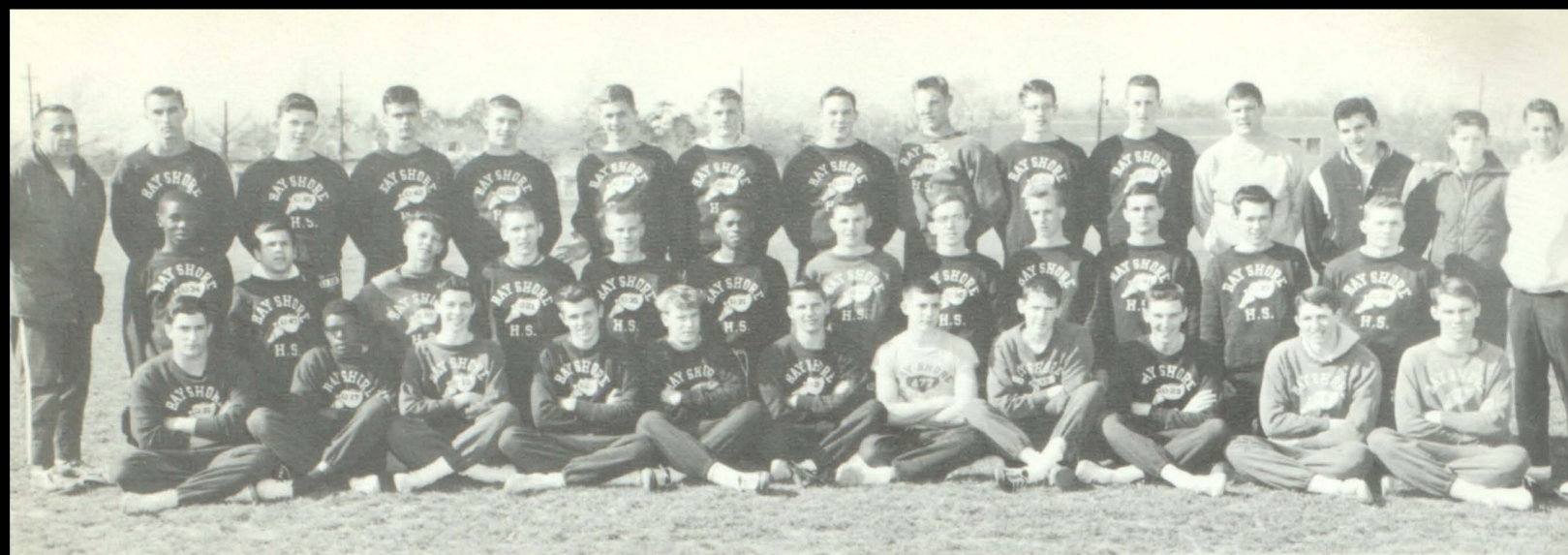

Gold Key winners from all schools attend the annual spring banquet with their principals and physical education teachers as guests of the Suffolk County Girls Athletic Association.

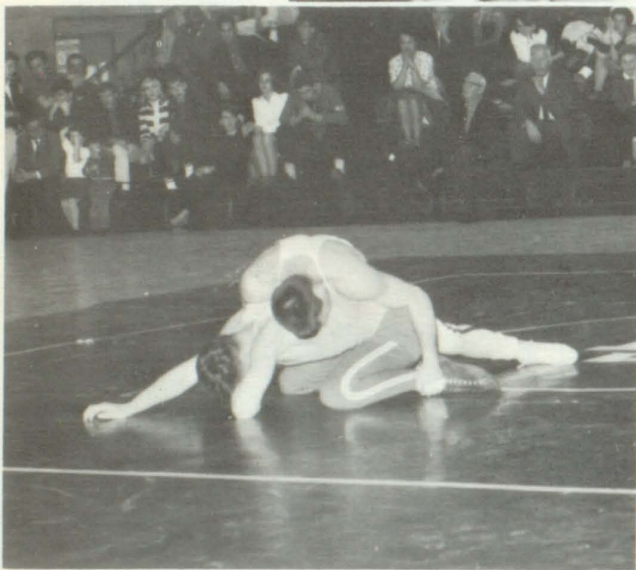
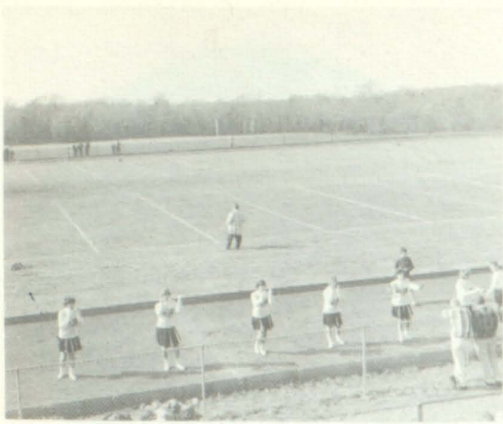
