GENERAL ORGANIZATION

This year the G.O. set itself many goals, including one hundred percent membership, more representative exchange of views at Board of Control meetings, and sponsorship of at least one activity a month.

The plans of the Activities Committee included pep rallies, a Rockin' Nanny, High School Bowls whose main purpose was to build spirit within the individual classes, dances with various themes, an intra-school postal system, and a G.O. Board of Control dinner at the end of the year. The Advisory Council, which handles all G.O. matters which cannot be taken care of efficiently during one Board of Control meeting, reached most of its goals despite the difficulty it experienced in getting enough publicity to gain support of the entire student body. The council worked on drafting a suitable dress code, updating the G.O. Constitution, and publishing a Club Handbook which is to be the forerunner of a school handbook.


HONOR SOCIETY

ROMANI HODIERNI





Romani Hodierni, or Romans of Today, is an especially fitting name for the Latin club of Bay Shore High School. Advised by Mrs. Harmon, and with membership limited to those taking third and fourth year Latin, the club combines the academic and social aspects of school life in the unique setting of one of the world's great classical tongues.

The yearly Saturnalia, an ancient Roman feast, is held near Christmas time and is the main social event which the club sponsors. Members wear togas and imitate the Roman style of eating, which is quite different from ours. In March all members are eligible for a national test in Latin for which prizes are offered. Finally, at the end of the school year it is traditional to hold a dinner for the departing seniors.

Romani Hodierni is more than recognition of satisfactory accomplishment in Latin, for it provides enjoyment and culture to those with a common background of Latin study. Translated, the motto of the Spanish Club, "Saber es poder," means "To know is to be able." As one of the language clubs, this one too has its individual projects and specialties. Among these are a trip to New York City and the World's Fair.

During the club's regular monthly meetings, interesting speeches and discussions are presented. Carlos Avena, our foreign student, has spoken about his home in Argentina, and Mark Wellens has talked about his trip to Mexico.




Fornd Farmer was high scorer with 398 points, and recovered the most rebounds, 232. Danny Wilkins had the best foul shoot-





Among the club's activities are a Mother-Daughter night, when mothers, too, participate in sports, the Varsity Club night, and an annual picnic at the end of the school year.


The members of the Leaders Club aid the girls Phys. Ed. classes by leading calisthenics, by officiating, and by offering further assistance in intramurals.

It is generally agreed by the Class of '65 that this year's senior class is the best in Bay Shore High School's history.
















SUSAN BREWER
