Leaving teacher in the dark?

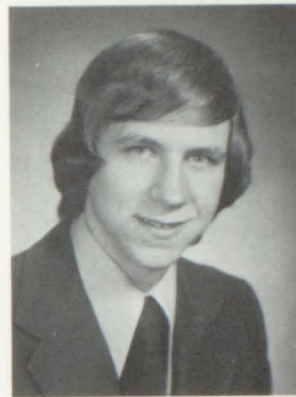

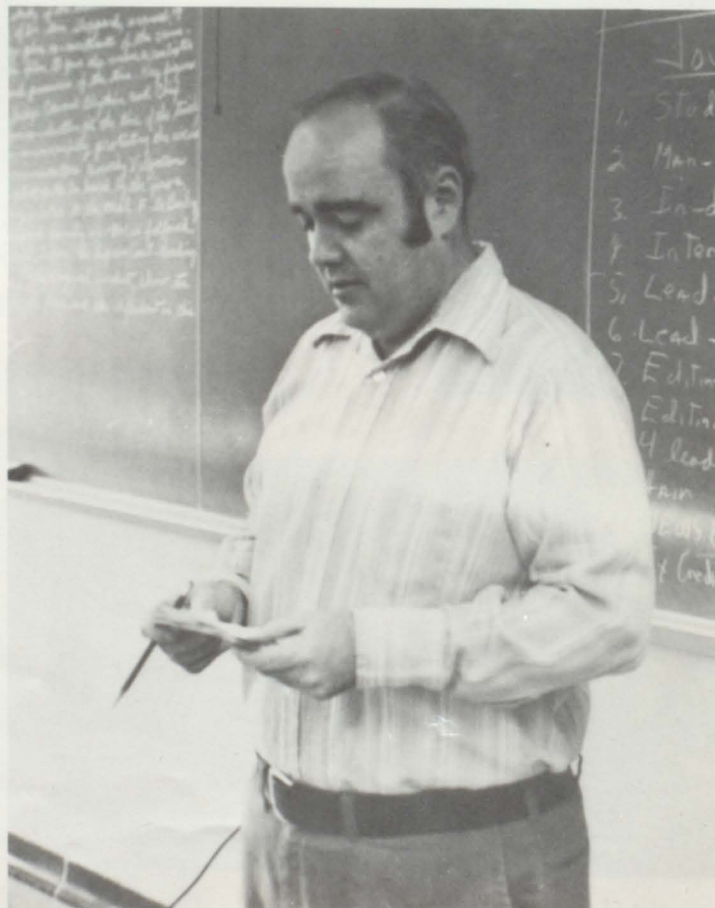
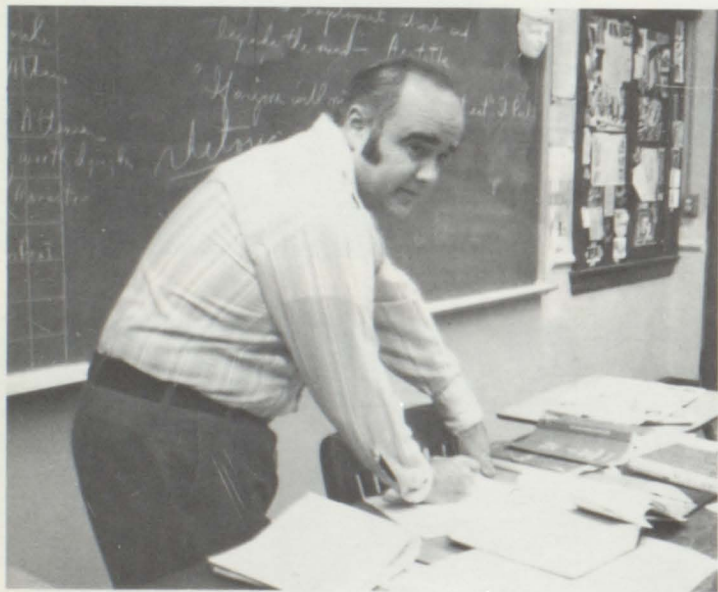
## JOHN T. NASH

# Back Stage Club

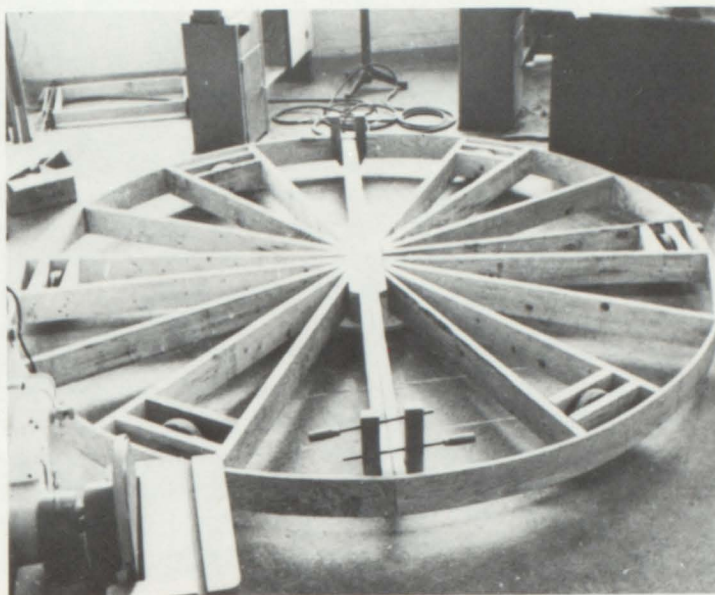

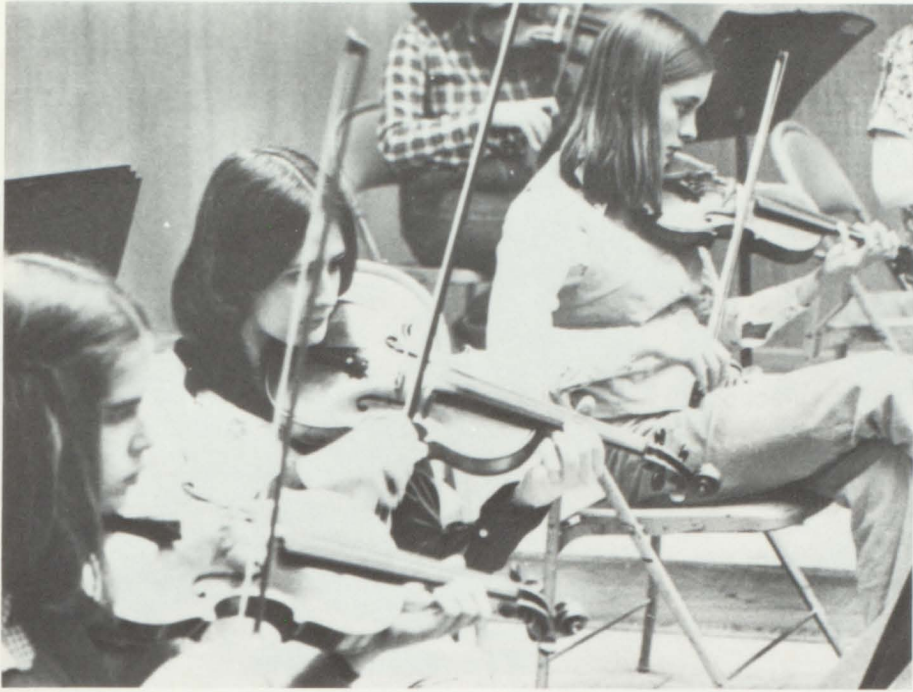
Most people don't realize how much work goes into making a really great orchestra. It's just like any other subject, you've got to study. As the old adage says, 'practice makes perfect'.

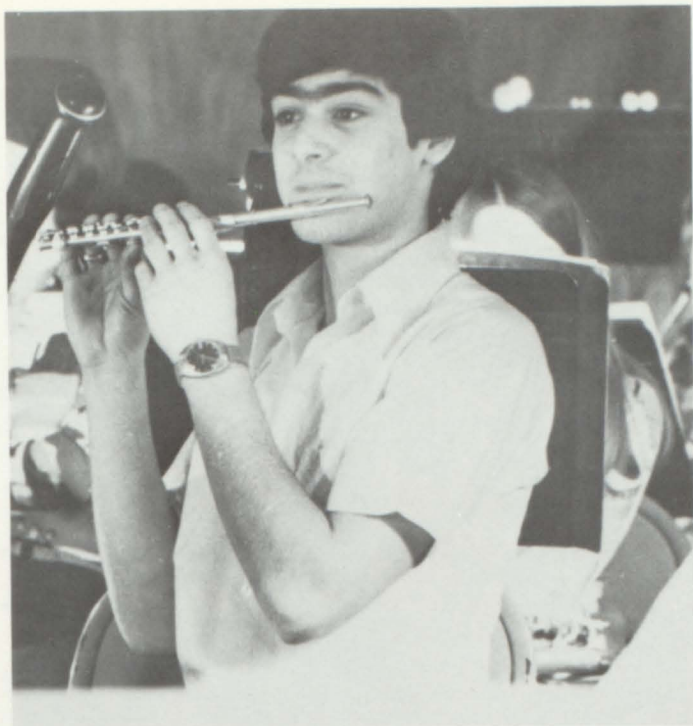

The graduating officers from the band, along with the other members of the senior class, felt that it was a fitting tribute given them by the band at commencement.

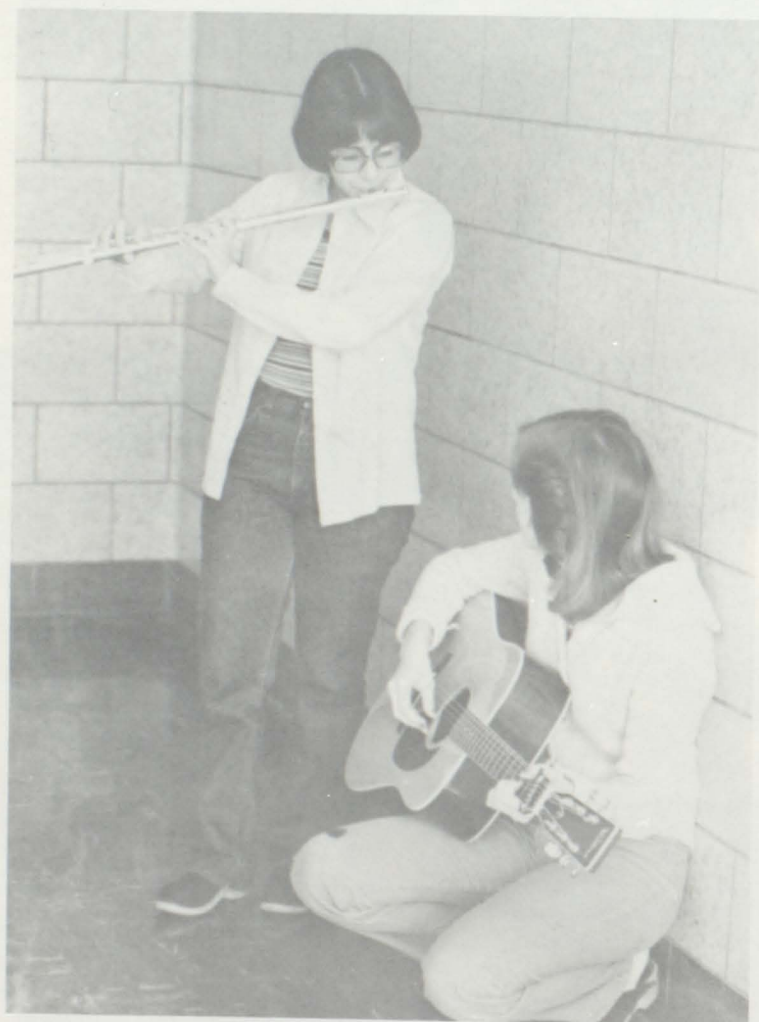
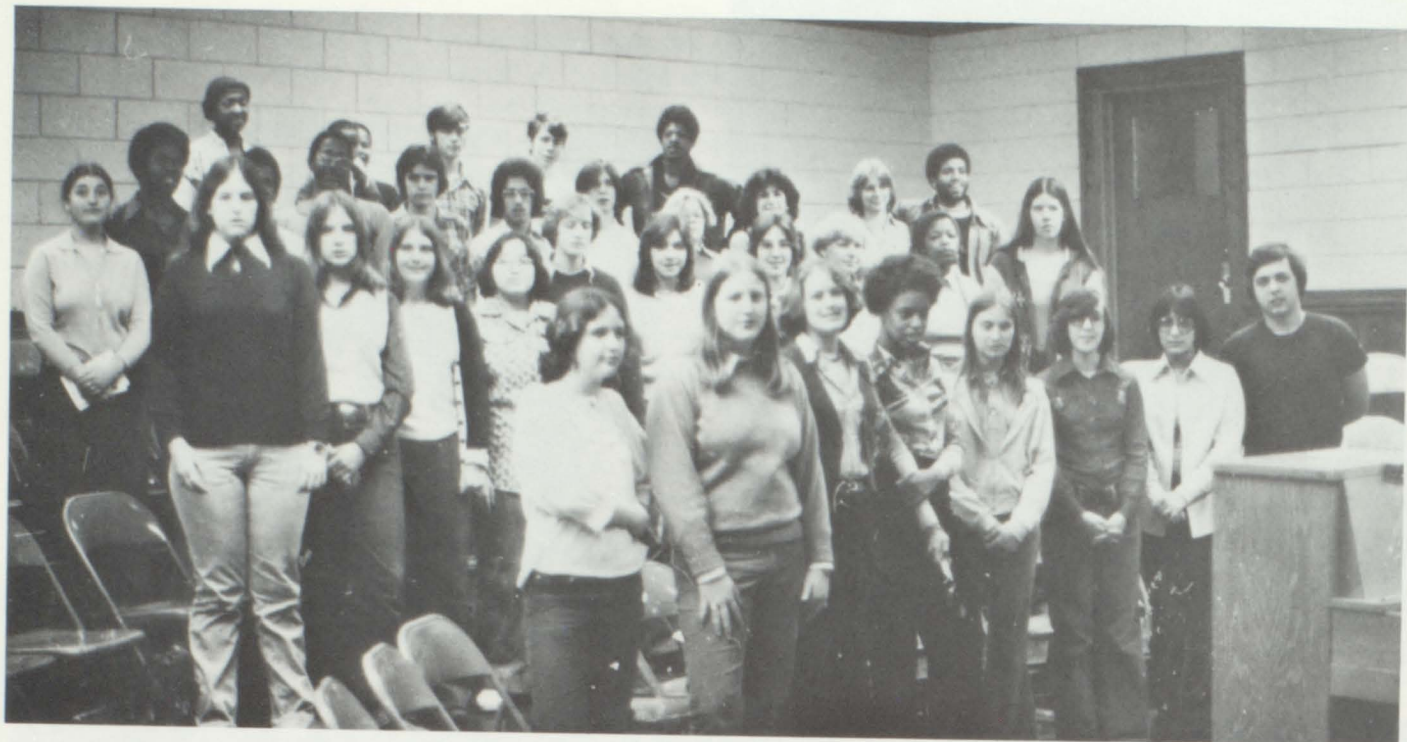

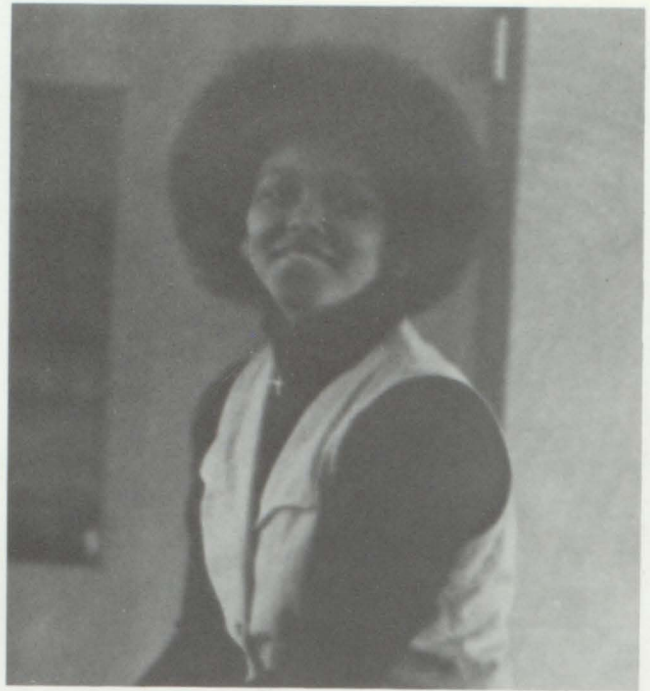






# B.S.O.S.S.

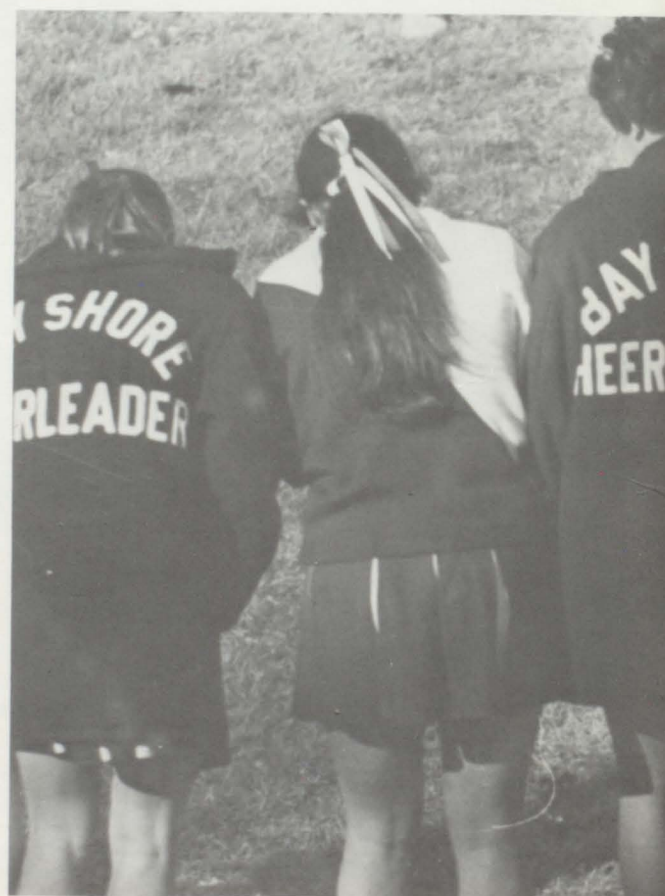

Andy Athing summed the season up by saying, "We played a good season, even though we were let down a few times. Mr. Breda was a real good coach."



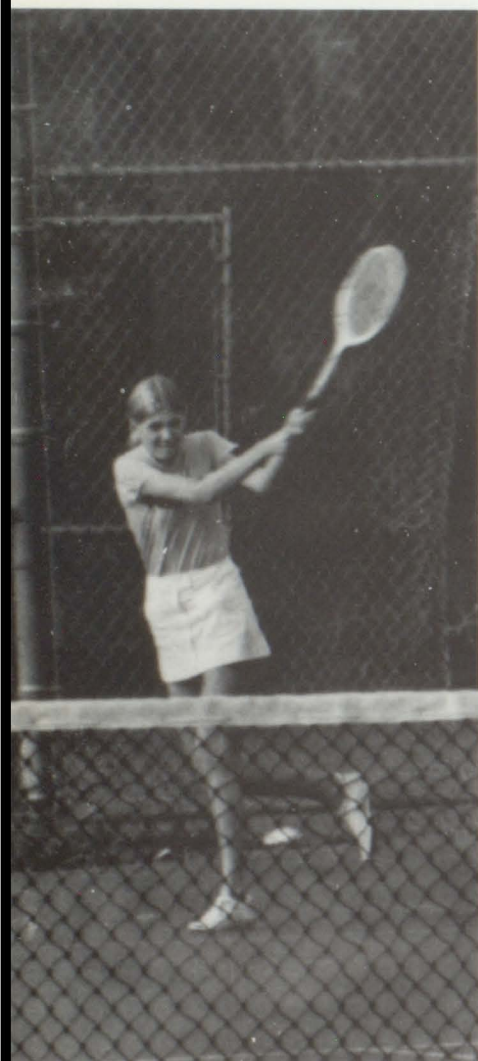
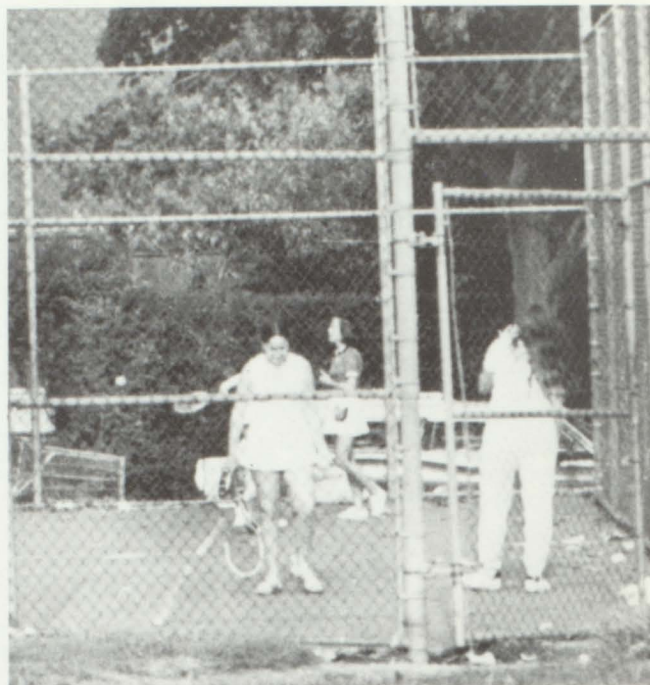






# Tennis

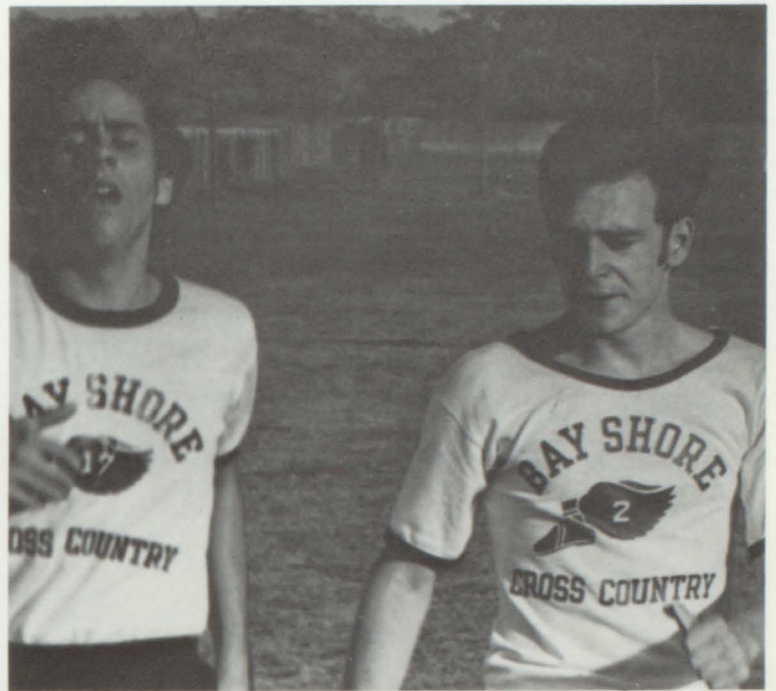

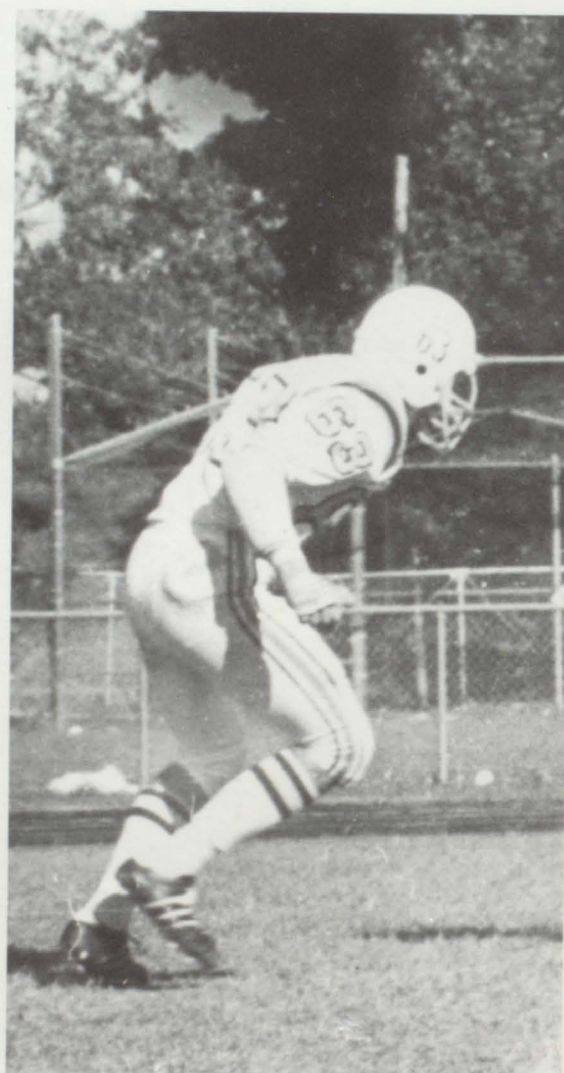
# Tremendous Team Spirit . . .

# J.V. Football

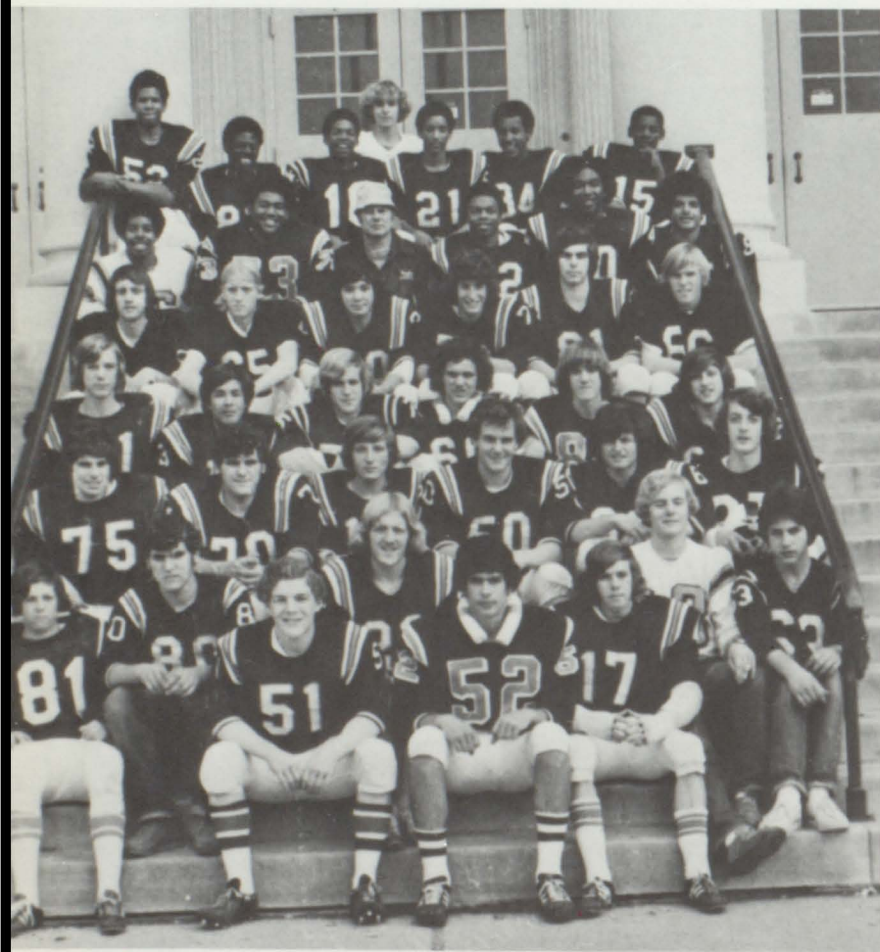
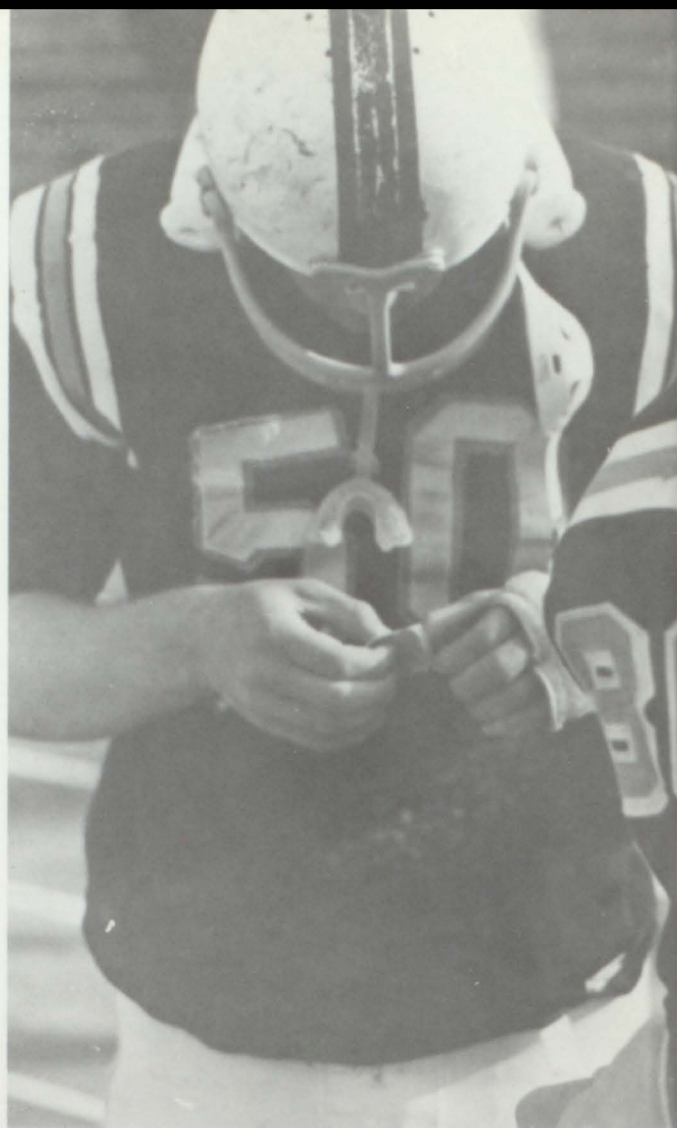
"It's great to be on a winning team," commented one J.V. team member. His enthusiasm was well received. The team showed an equal balance of strength in areas of both offense and defense.

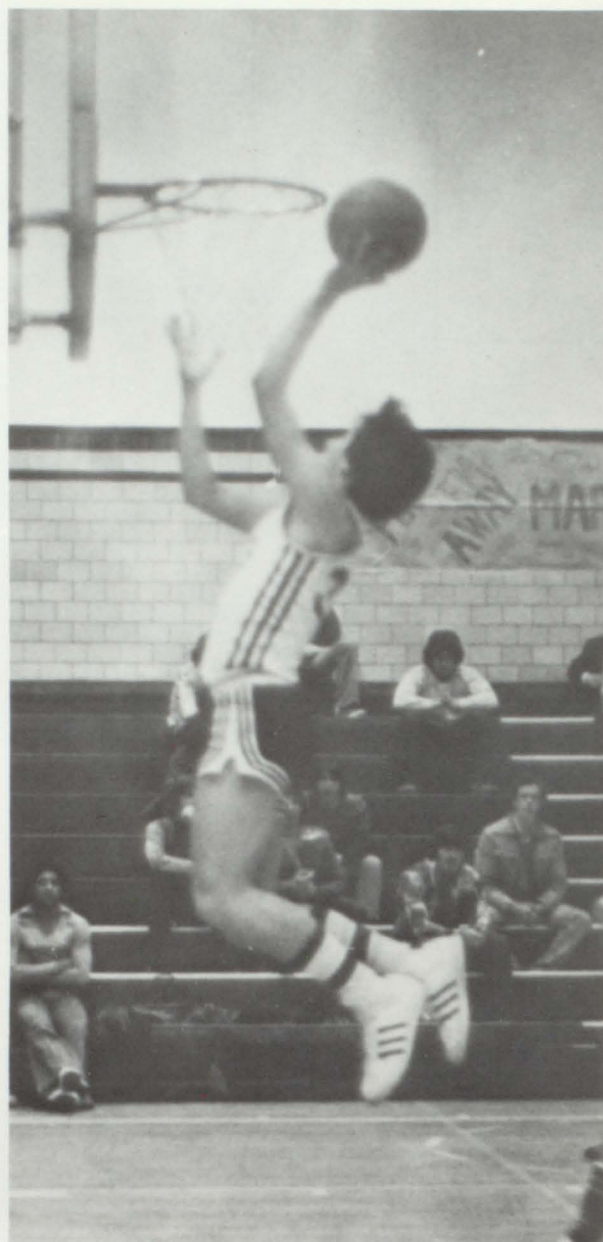


# J.V. Basketball

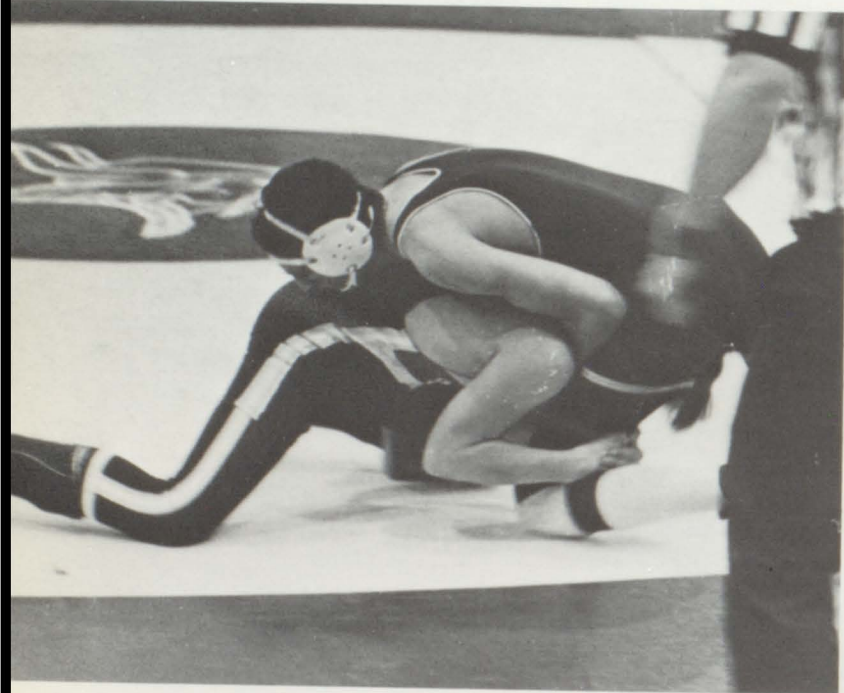
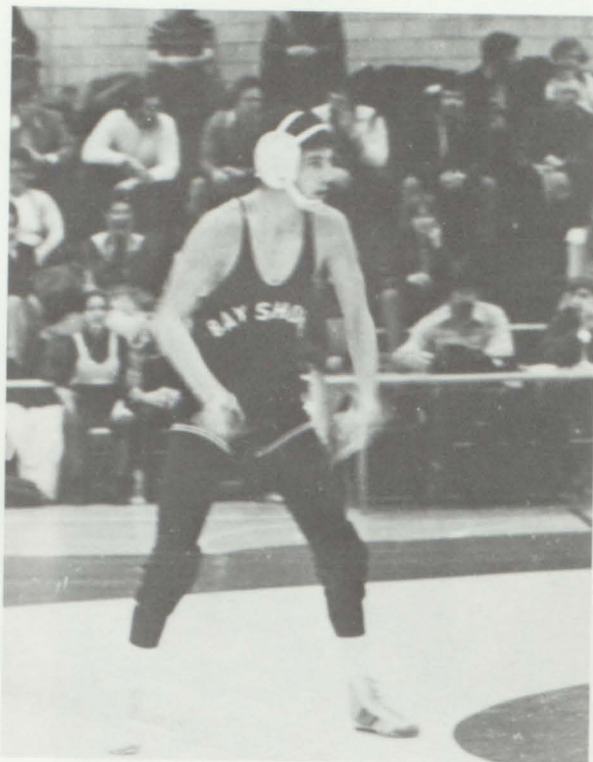




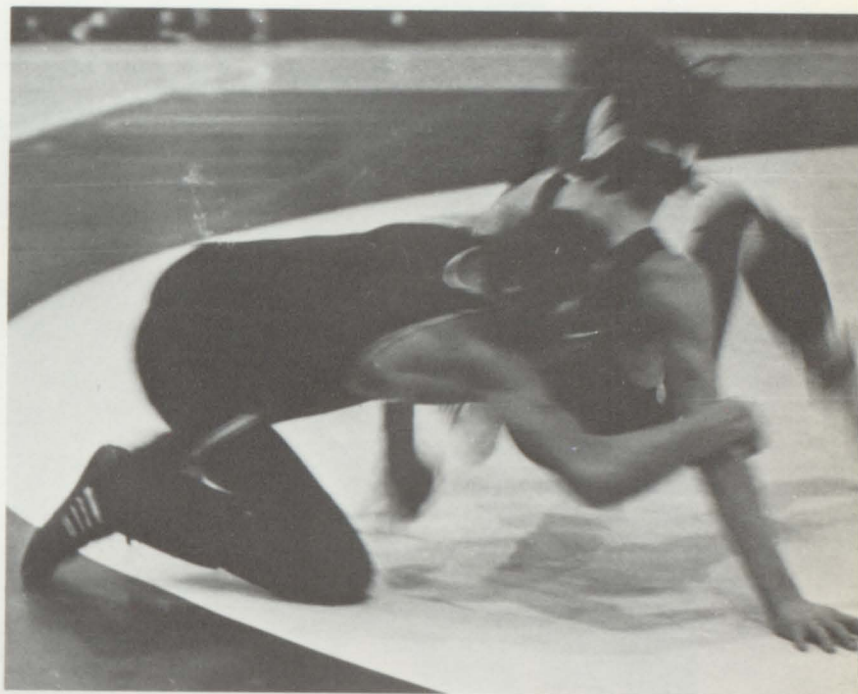
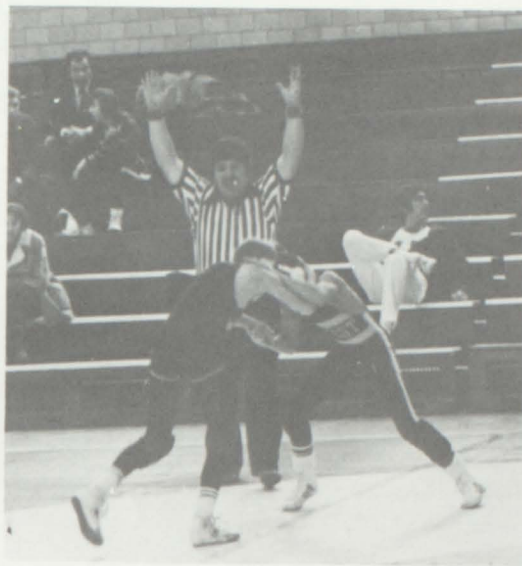
# Wrestling

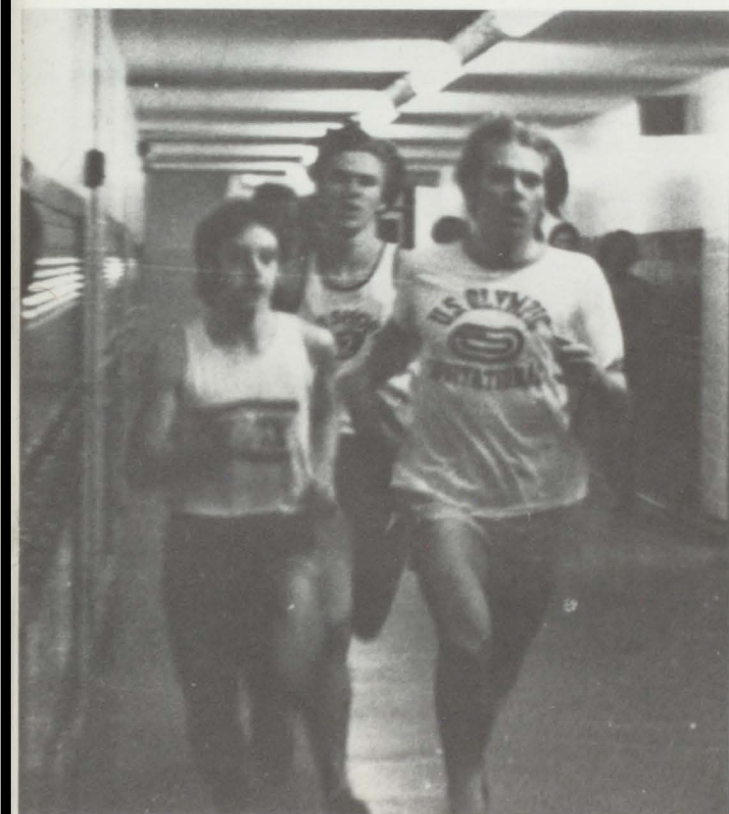
Bay Shore placed second in the Conference "B" championships, fifth in the Suffolk County championship, and sixth in the Long Island Championships.

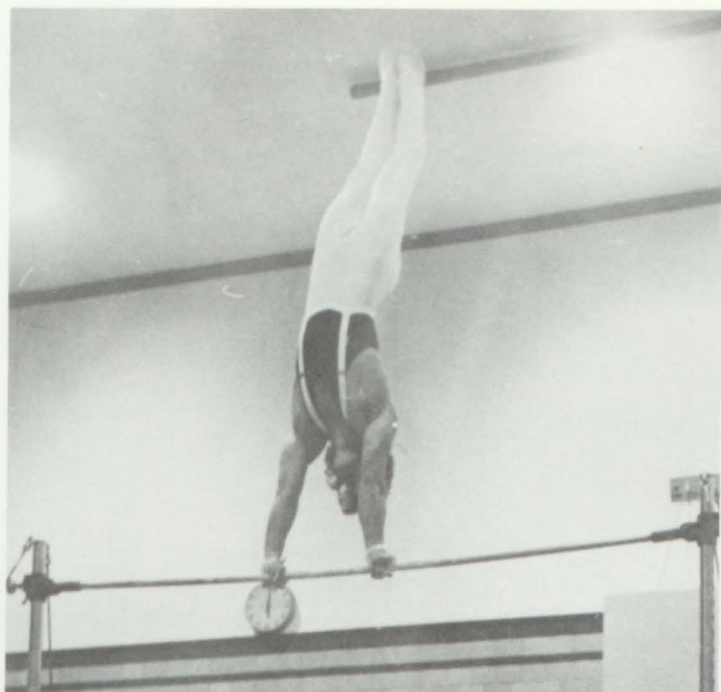

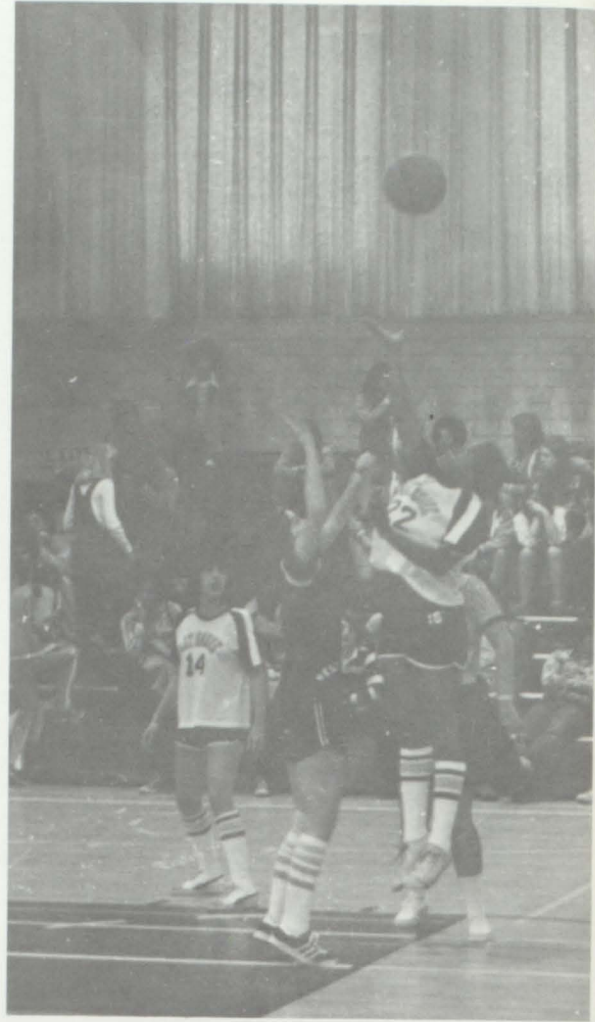




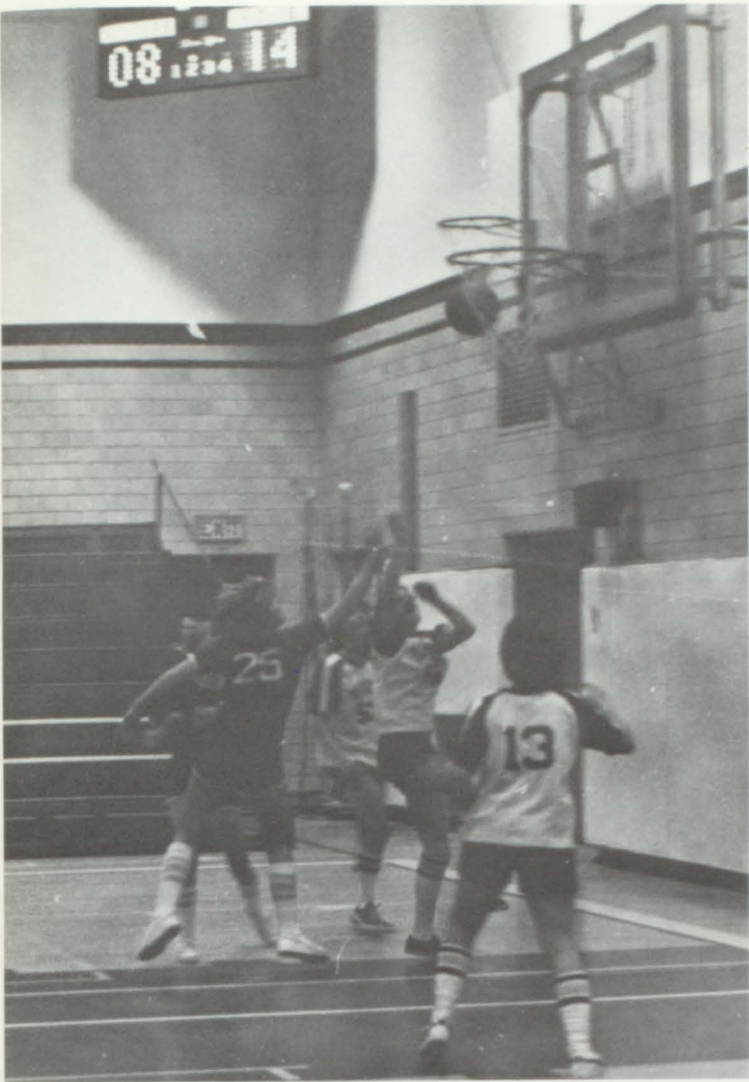
# Varsity Basketball

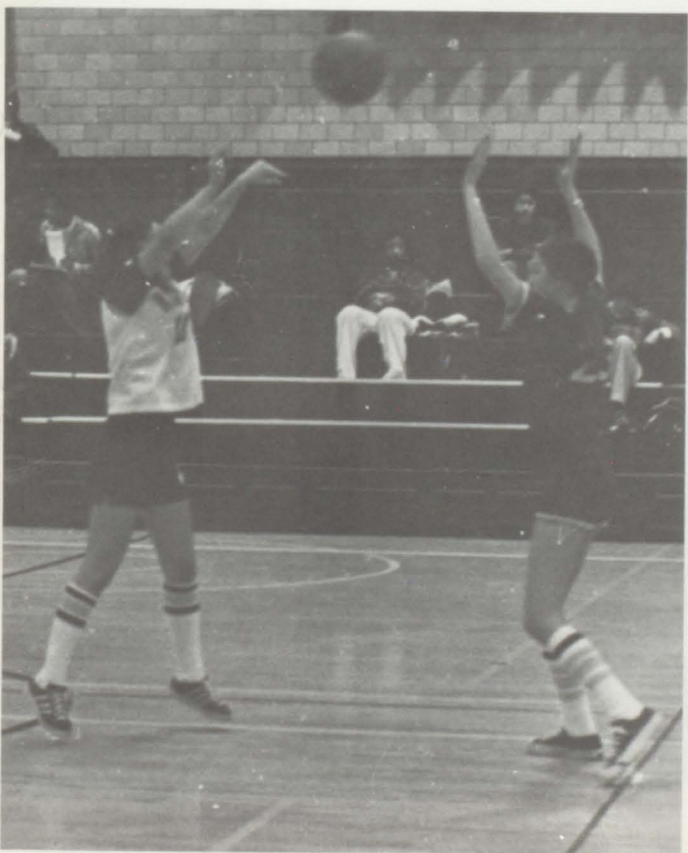
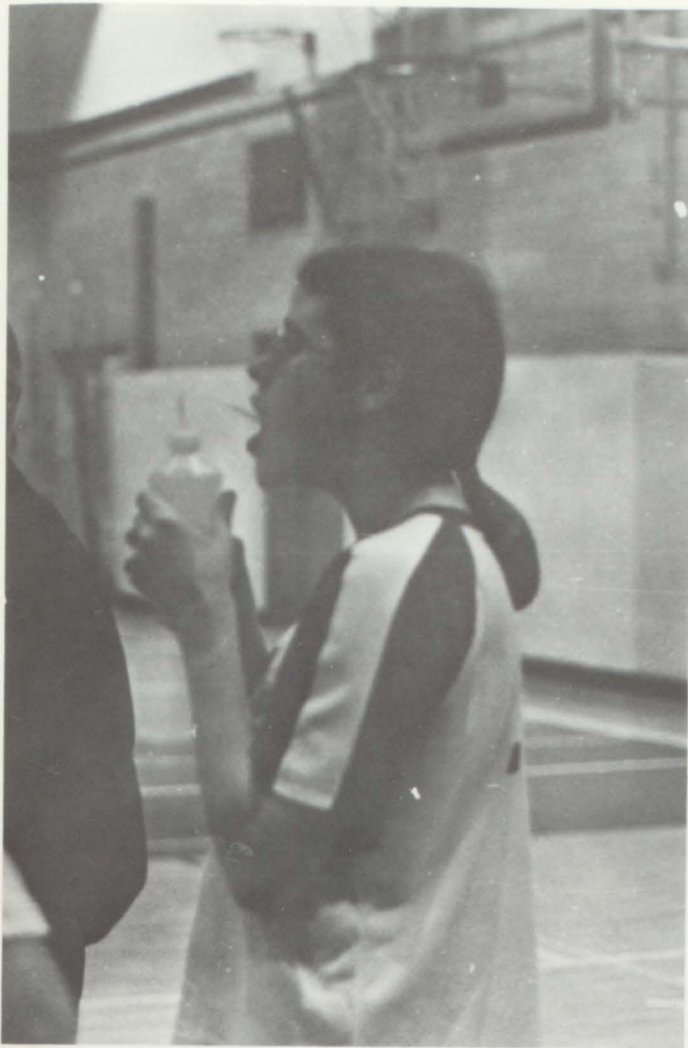

# Girls Volleyball

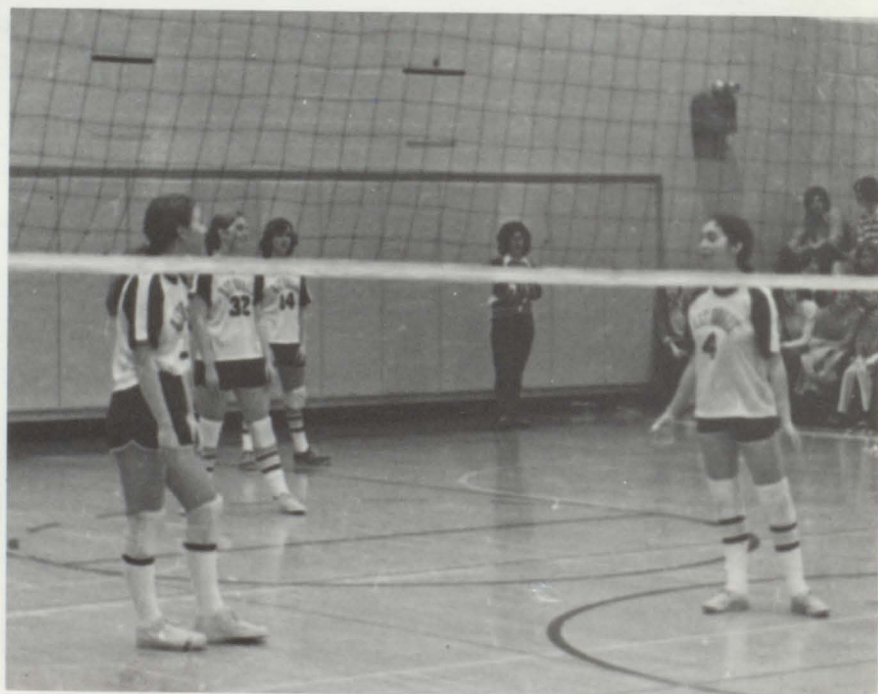
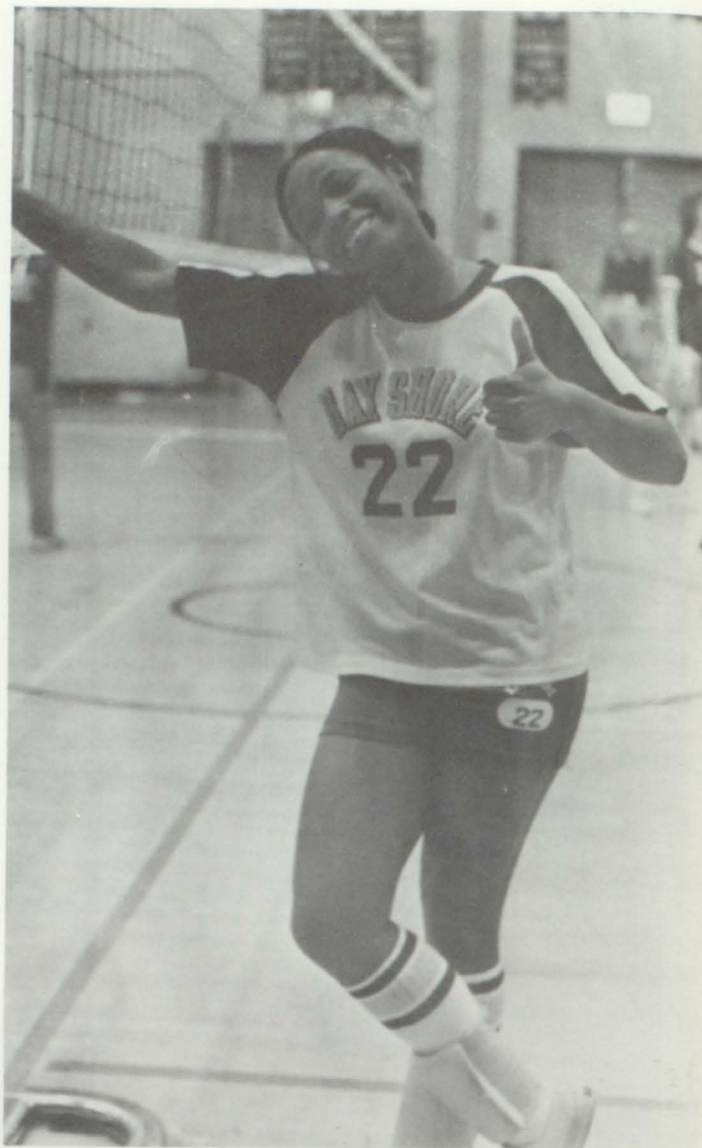

"Also, it was a very cooperative team. No one was out to gain individual recognition. Because of this, they played well together."







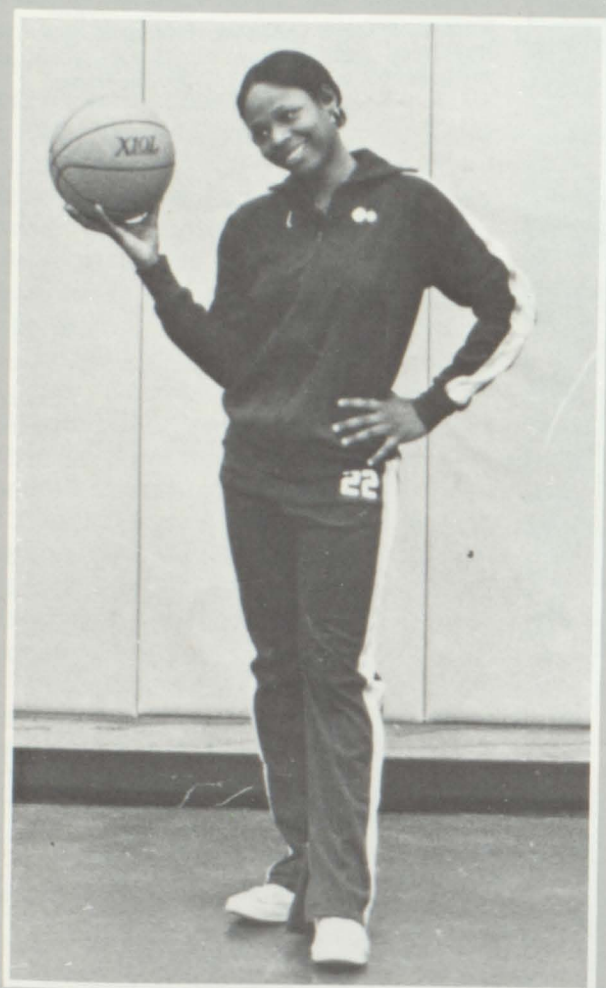

# Retiring

## Raymond R. Howard

After a 28 year association with the Bay Shore Schools, Mr. Raymond Howard is retiring, at the end of this his tenth year as Superintendent of Schools.

"I'm a firm believer in trying to live your life in increments; that's probably the reason I'm resigning as superintendent," began Mr. Howard. "People say, 'Why would you want to resign at 55, in good health?'" and they want to know 'Why quit?' And the answer is it's time to quit."

Born in Albany in 1922, Mr. Howard graduated from his hometown high school class. He played varsity football in high school, was in dramatics, choir, and played piano in the dance band. Mr. Howard began state college in 1941, but interrupted his sophomore year to enlist in the Air Force.

Mr. Howard went back to college in January 1945, and completed his undergraduate degree (in business education, and social studies with emphasis on economics and finance) in three years.

Necessity pushed Howard to look for a teaching job on Long Island. "I began teaching in Bay shore because it was close to Columbia," (where he was studying for his doctorate) he recalled. "I had been offered a job in three other schools, and although Bay Shore had the lowest salary of the four, my wife and I liked the area; so I took the job, teaching business education."

Mr. Howard's skill in matters of money was primarily responsible for his move up to administrator. "I was a teacher and still had my outside accounting work, and one of my clients was the school district. Dr. Moreland (then superintendent of schools) decided he'd like to have more of my time, so in 1960, he offered me a position as assistant high school principal in which I would spend part of my time working with the budget and finance and the other part working with students."

Howard rose rapidly to the position of assistant superintendent in charge of business and finance in 1962. In 1966 he was unofficial acting superintendent when Dr. Moreland became ill, and was officially appointed temporary acting superintendent in 1967.

"The board had set March 1, 1967 as the date they would announce the new superintendent, and I had arranged to play golf in Bermuda that week. Well, the night before I was to leave, Mr. Christie, then the president of the school board, asked me as if still a bit surprised. "So I went over, expecting him to tell me who the next superintendent was going to be. He said they'd interviewed quite a few people and thought about it—and then made me an offer I couldn't refuse: 'a substantial increase in salary and a five year contract.'"

Howard's career has been one of many transitions, but he notes that the most difficult one was that from assistant superintendent to superintendent.

I think the most interesting part of my job is the dealing with people," remarked Mr. Howard, "I like to talk about the schools with the students, parents, the service clubs and the faculty groups. On a personal level, it allows me to work with every facet of the community. I have met and known thousands of Bay Shore people."

Mr. Howard noted that there had been a great deal of progress made during his tenure as chief administrator. He cited the introduction of teacher-aides, the performing arts program, curriculum guides, cyclical scheduling, the APEX English program, and increased enrollment in BOCES as some of the accomplishments of his administration. Defending his record in economics, he added, "I'm proud of the fact that we can get more education out of a buck than a lot of other districts do."

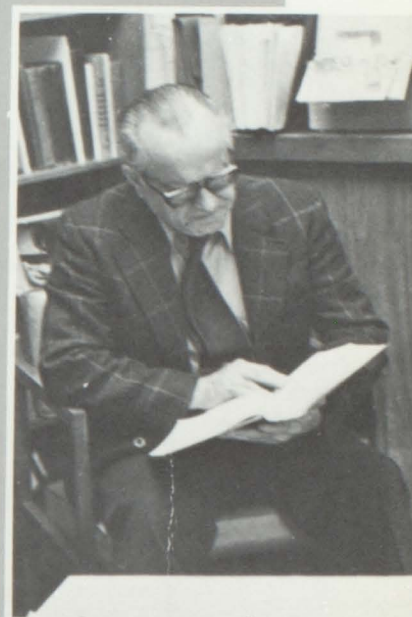
"Among Mr. Howard's plans for his new free time will be golfing, fishing, and "especially reading. I've got hundreds of books which I haven't been able to look at; I may take a month sometime and do nothing but read." He also plans to go back to England with his wife in July, and spend time at his farm upstate.

Reflecting on a long career, Mr. Howard remarked, "I think I have made a contribution to education. One of the finest tributes ever paid to me—it touched me the most—was at an annual dinner of a group of church people that I was invited to. At the end, several members who knew I was resigning wished me well and then an elderly gentleman—one of the seniors of the church—came up. He said to me, 'We're going to miss you; you've done a good job.' And finally he said, "You've made a difference." And I hope my having been superintendent for ten years has made a difference, for the good. I think the school district today is stronger and in a better position than it was when I began."

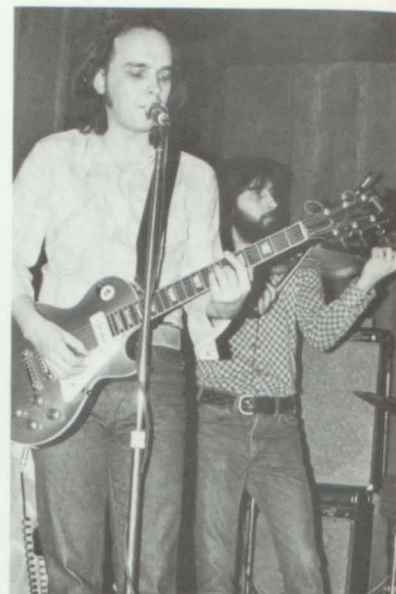
"I have never done anything which I probably wouldn't have done again differently," he continued. "However, I don't think that I have many regrets in my life. Life's been good to me. I look back on the past as being a pretty wonderful experience, and I look forward to my next 'increment of life.' " He leaned forward and thought for a moment. As if suddenly inspired, he looked away and a smile of self-satisfaction spread across his face. "If someone said to me, would you like to be 25 years old again, I would say no—because I wouldn't want to have to wait another 30 years to get to where I am now."
