
Past-Times, what does that mean? After long deliberation, we decided to incorporate the two main ideas that we had into one basic theme.

Thus, we present Past-Times, Maroon and White 1978.






























































BOCES ...


What is BOCES?

It is not only a building where classes are held, but it is an experience; it is a chance to learn a skill that can be put to use once the student graduates.




The reason why the corridors are empty is because the students want to be there and they are too busy enjoying themselves in class.
























































The team's coach Joe Erickson displayed undying faith in the boys' ability despite the disappointing season. He concluded, "If I had to, I'd do it all again."












The performances during half-time at home football games always out did the one before it.



But even when football season is long over, one can still imagine that he hears echoes of music and one, two, three, turn left . . .










Varsity Tennis

Coach Eleanor Eckman commented on the teams winning season, "This is the best team I've ever had in the way they worked together as a team and as individual players."





The teams hopes were surpassed when they were able to play more games than they had anticipated but still had time to brush up on basic skills.


The team tied the game with Smithtown placing them in line for first place.

"We didn't win the game," concluded senior Diane Clehane, "but it was great. This is the most school spirit I've seen in the three years I've been here."








After a somewhat disappointing beginning, the varsity basketball team pulled a surprising comeback. The teams record (league and non-league was 7-5).


This year's J.V. basketball team has proven to be one of the best in Bay Shore's history.

As basketball has always been one of the school strong points, this season proved to be very disappointing to the girls.


Their record for the season stood at 3-9; they attributed their poor showing to lack of height, the teams tallest member being 5'8'.

Good performances for the years were given by Tracey Brown on offense and Alvin Scott on defense.



The choir proved that no matter what time of day it is, they are capable of singing their best.





Dedication ...






This year, the class of 1978 has voted overwhelmingly to award the dedication of its yearbook to a man who has brought great changes to Bay Shore High School in this last year.

It was a night to remember. After two months of preparation everything fell perfectly into place. The weather was threatening but a capacity crowd filled the boys gym.


Over seventy members worked on the show along with chairperson Diane Clehane. President Anita Peyser and Lisa Swinson coached various aspects of the project.


"The show was so much fun for everybody. I loved wearing the tux and seeing everyone have so much fun. The show is one thing about senior year I'll never forget," reflected Diane.

A Golden Anniversary ...





Blizzard of '78 ...





5-7; it lasted three days and left us with two feet of snow and four foot drifts. That storm immobilized not only individuals, but towns, counties, and states for several days.


