They try to make you a bit more comfortable. At first it is awkward with so many people asking you so many questions about your life in your home country, but later on you begin to get used to it and begin to enjoy it. But you cannot always answer the questions thrown at you. For instance, people ask me if India has metaled roads and whether we ride camels. These sort of questions are ridiculous and they can put you in a tight spot.

People judge your actions and deeds much more than they would judge an American's. At times you can be rejected, not always gently, by a group. This is tough on an exchange student who has left all his or her friends behind. This really can make an exchange student a bored person as he or she has come into alien territory not knowing what to expect. But in my case, I was immediately absorbed into a wonderful set of friends.

Being an exchange student has its pros and cons but the pros far outweigh the cons and in most cases it is a super memorable year.

My greatest was collecting stamps, but school keeps me too busy for that any more. I like very much to watch tennis, table tennis, and basketball. Sports give me something!

Further, I like going out to a disco. Doing all these things keeps you busy quite nicely.

My father is a minister in the Reformed Church; my mother is a correctrix for a publisher. My family is big and it is very important to me, but it is too much to tell here. I hope you can understand it.

I do not know precisely what I want to do after Secondary modern school, but one thing is sure for me: I want to do someting in the business sector, and to learn how to handle a computer. I think a year in America will be of great importance to me. I can learn so many things.
