













































"Diary of Anne Frank"




































Battle of the Classes

























"No, No Nanette"

Nanette, made this show humorous and entertaining.






























Battle of the Sexes

Her plans include traveling with her husband and when needed, to help the school in the transition to fill her position.


When asked what she will most remember about her years at BSHS, she quietly paused for a moment and then definitely responded "my colleagues — the faculty and staff, and students — we work well together."


As a parting message to the students she has grown so fond of, Mrs. Swital leaves this:


