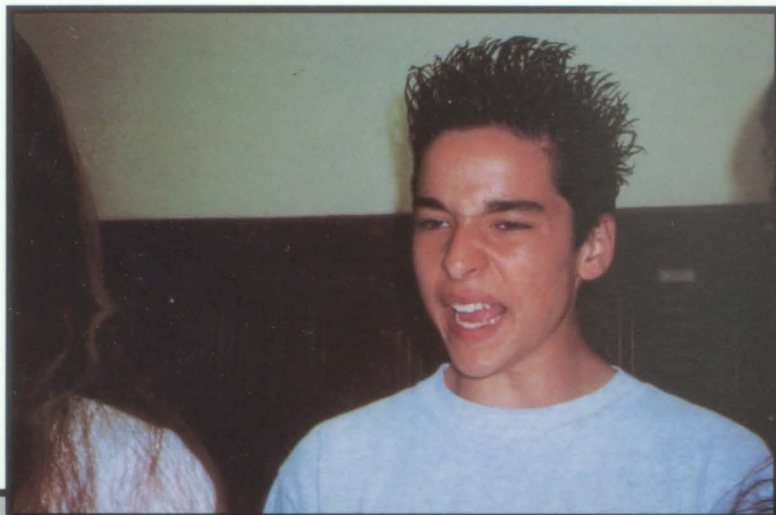
Spirit Week

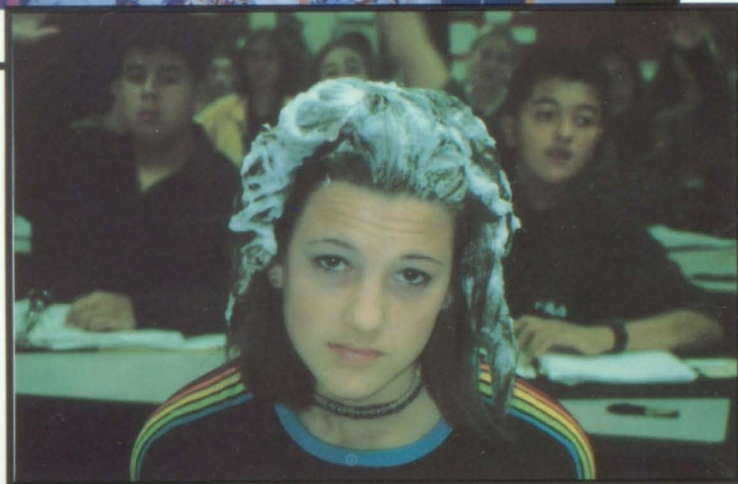
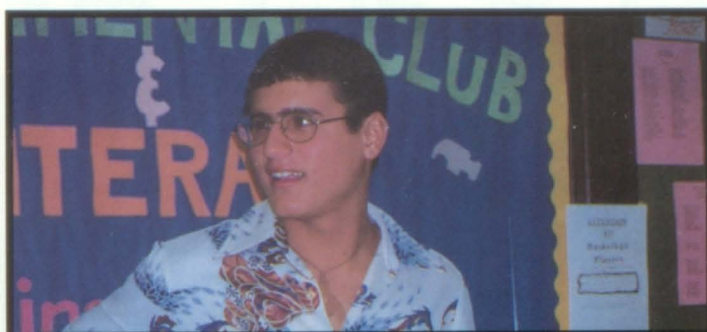

The weekend ended with dance competitions and games and the crowning of the king and queen. Homecoming weekend was truly a special moment for all.

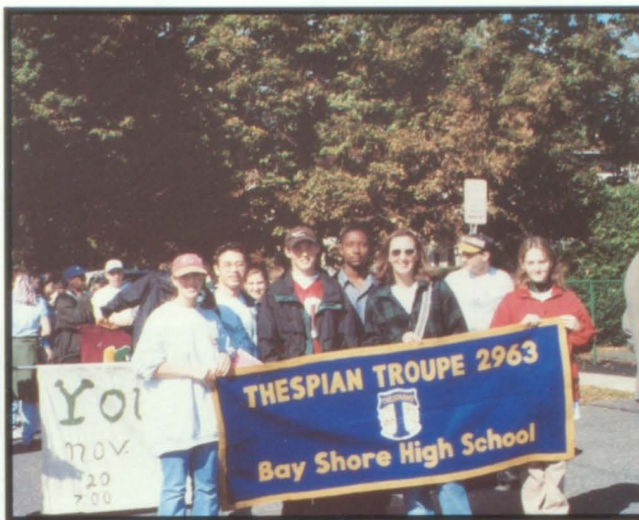

Happy Birthday

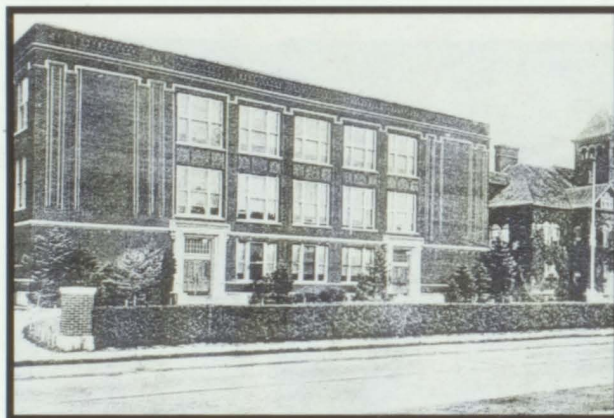
One hundred years ago who would have thought that the tiny wood frame structure on Fourth Avenue would grow to become one of the larger districts on Long Island? With a graduating class of only one male and one female in 1909, the school district now boasts a graduating class of nearly three hundred students. There were only twelve faculty members in the first Bay Shore High School as compared to the 150 full time teachers, administrators, and supporting staff. The average starting salary for teachers was between four and six hundred dollars. Graduation was held in the Carleton Opera House and later on in the Regent Theater. Regents exams existed even back then.

Bay Shore was then and is still recognized as a progressive school. Classes were well-conducted, and teachers were carefully supervised by the ever-vigilant townsfolk.

Bay Shore was the first district to have a school orchestra. The local "hangout" for students was the South Side Drug Store.

Bay Shore continues to grow as a community, proud of its early heritage.

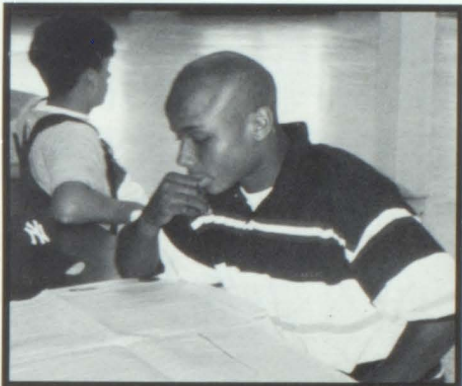

Making New Memories

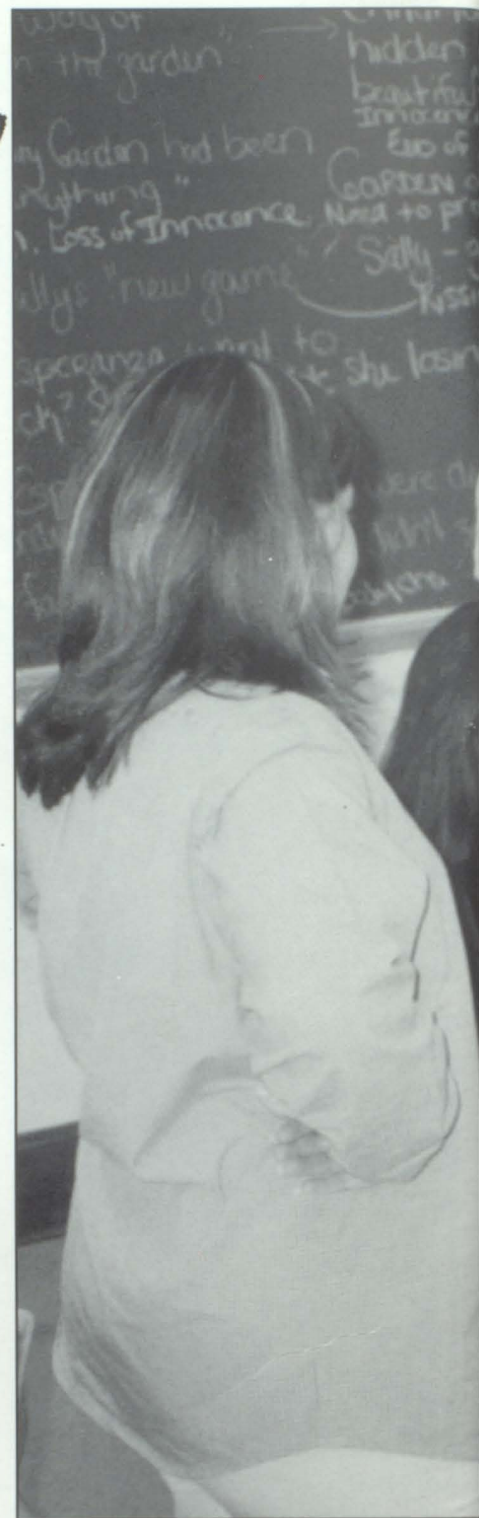

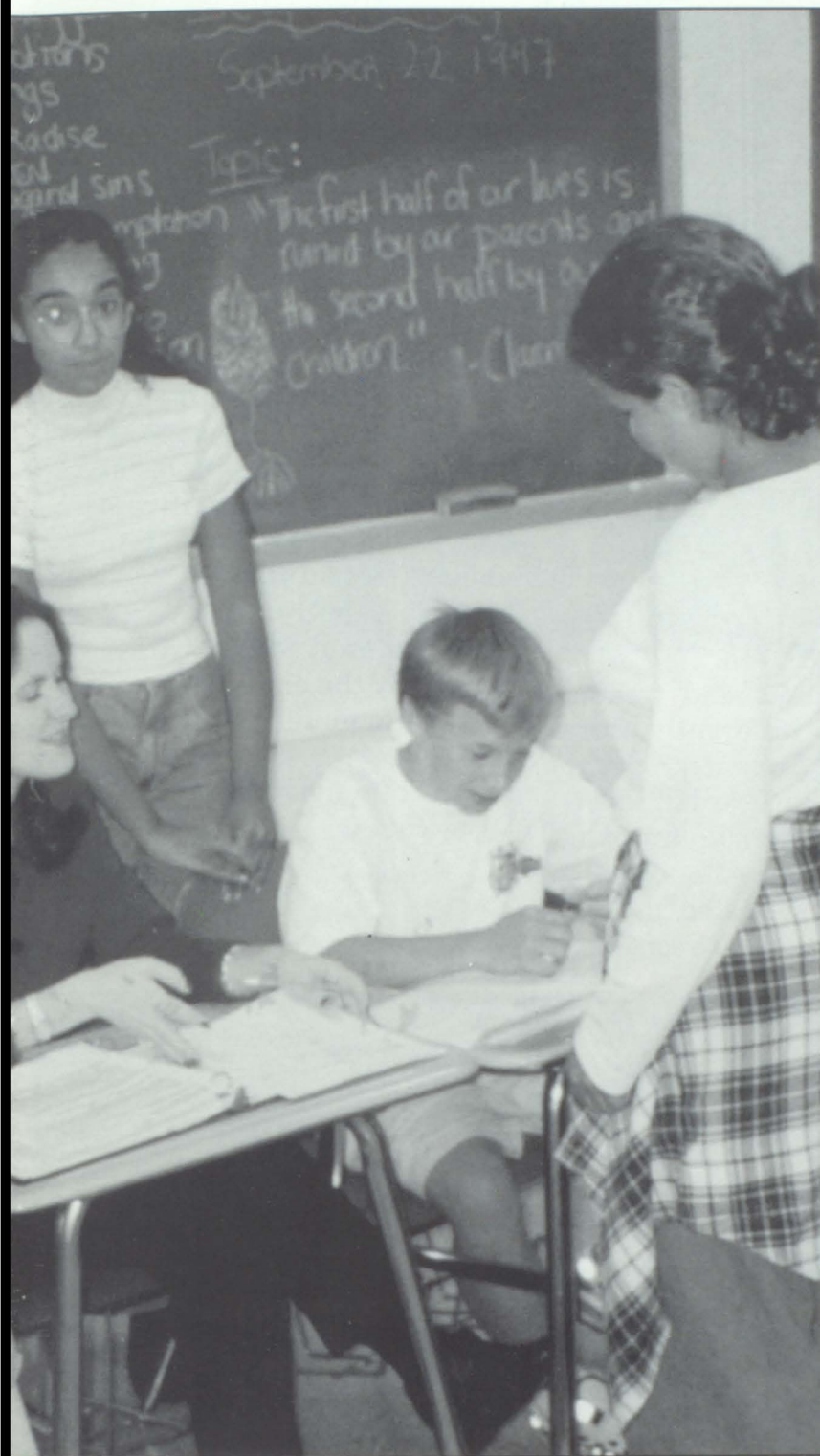

Music Theory Lab

On the cutting edge of multi-media

For some people composing their own songs and lyrics or setting them to a video is merely an unattainable dream. For the students in Mr. T. Scalzo's multi-media lab, that dream has come true.

Students in the Music Theory class learned basic music fundamentals and composition techniques through the use of computers. Each student was expected to submit one self-composed piece of music. Multi-Media Lab students produced videos, audio CDs, interactive CD ROMs, college portfolios, and altered



images, known as advanced imaging.

In this two-in-one class, the students were given a project by Superintendent Dr. E. Holman. The class compiled a twelve and a half minute video, based on the past four

years of community summits. There were 1500 copies made so that complimentary tapes could be given to this year's summit attendants. The name of this production was "Reaching New Heights."

Dennis Floridaia, who has produced his own CD, right in the classroom commented, "This class gave students the opportunity to take advantage of the cutting edge technology, which is the way of the future."

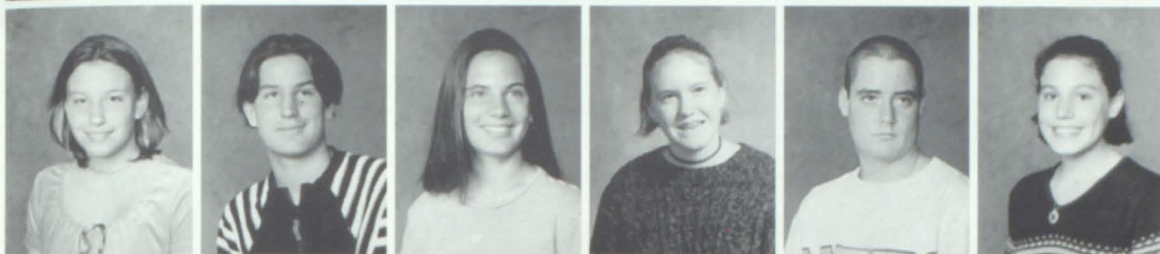

Karen talked about her interviews with such famous artists as Method Man from the Wu-Tang Clan and Lil Kim from the Junior Mafia.

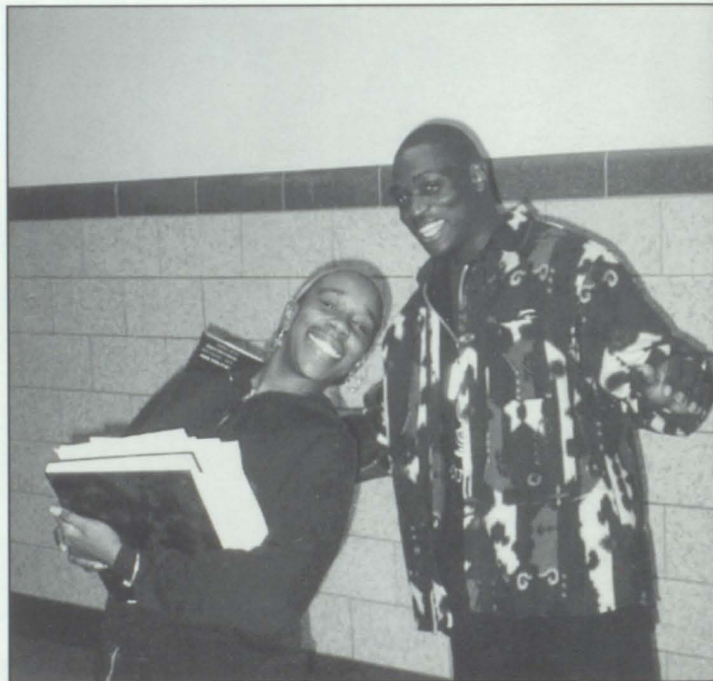
Karen offered to return to Bay Shore to judge a writing contest. For now she has returned home to Prairie View, Texas where she is working on her first book.

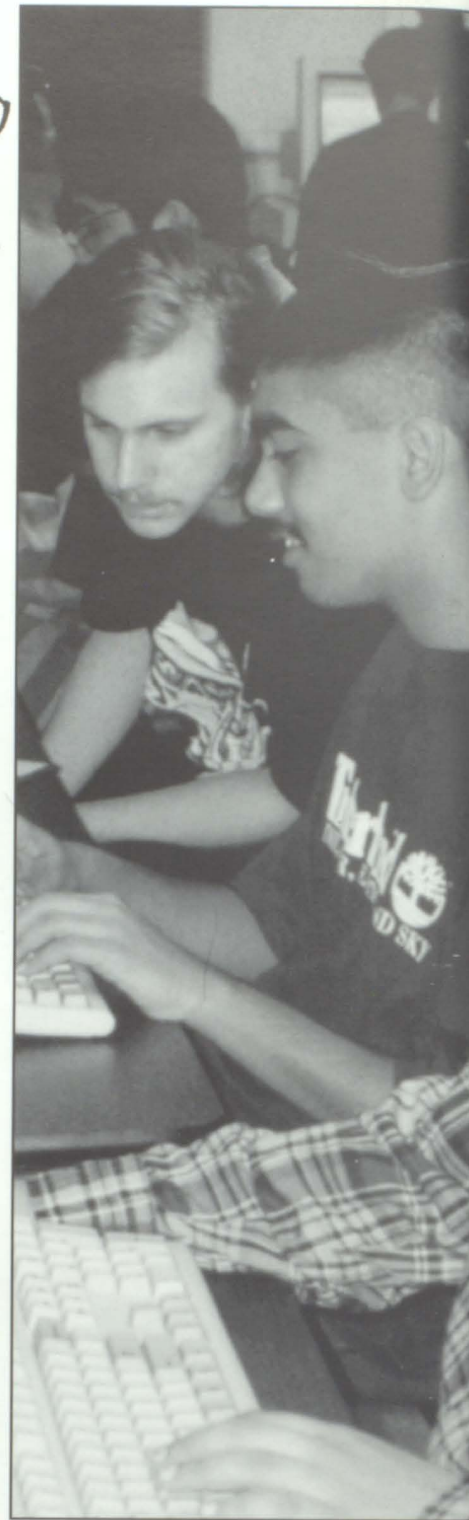
The Class of 2000

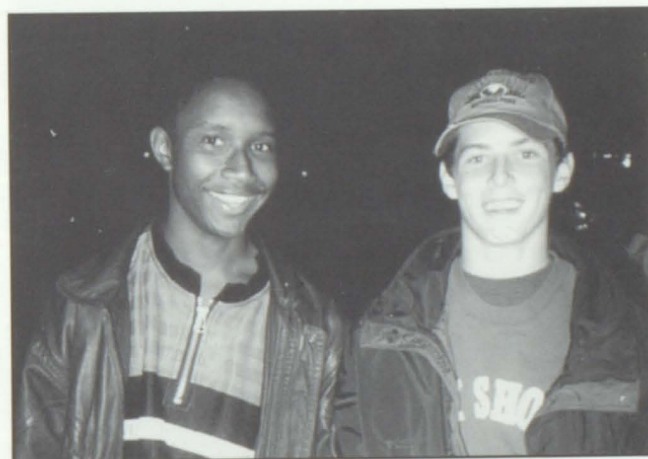
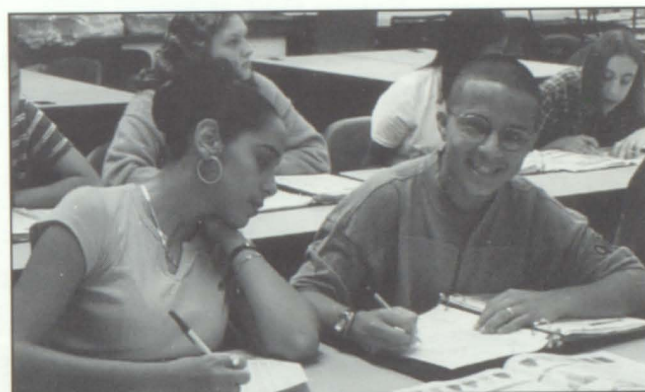
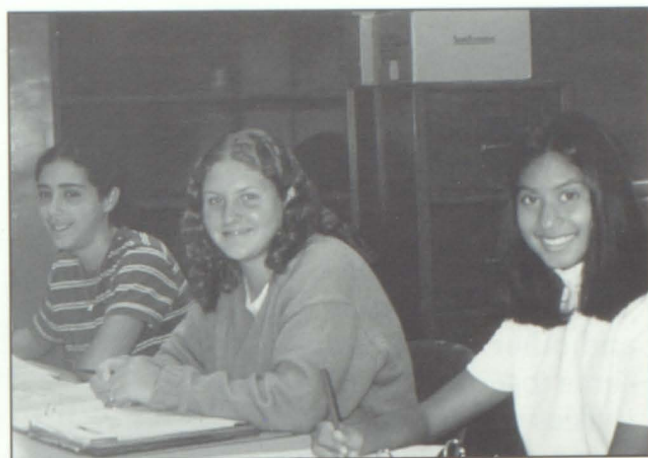

showing off his outstanding skills with a variety of partners. The most memorable moment of the night came when the students coaxed all the faculty and staff to join in the fun on the dance floor.

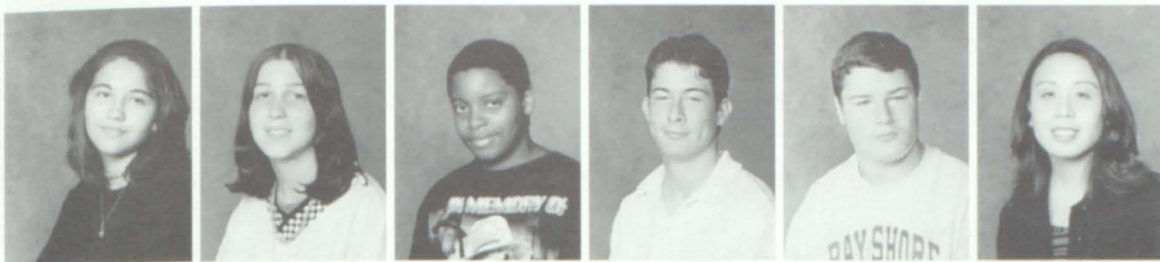
The party continued all

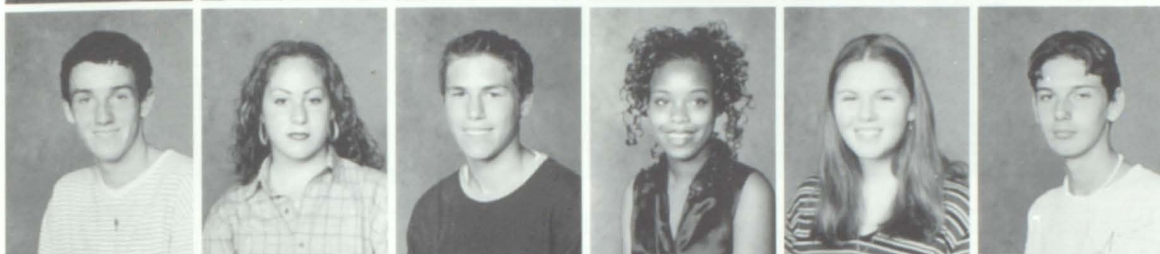

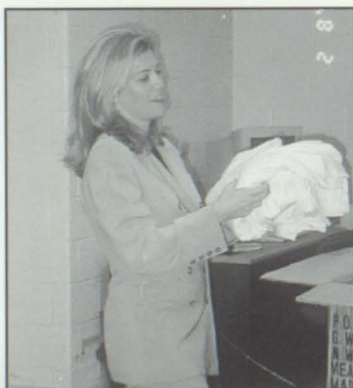
forming the ETS, Engineering Technology Society to later be included in B.A.R.T., the Bell Atlantic Robotics team.

"This was a wonderful experience for all involved and really made this period in time come alive for the students," said art teacher Ms. M. Pesco.

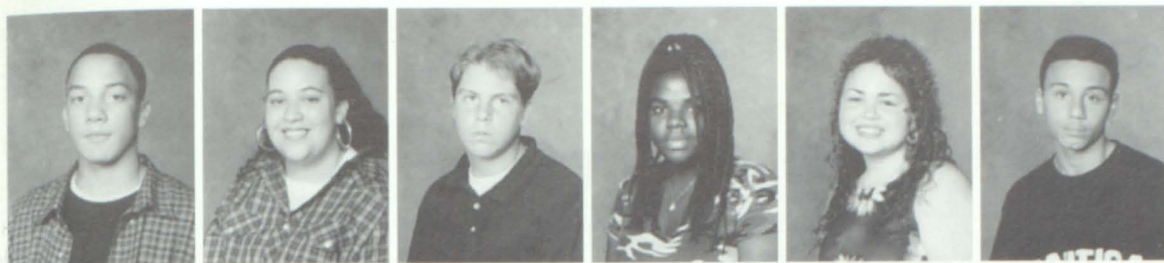

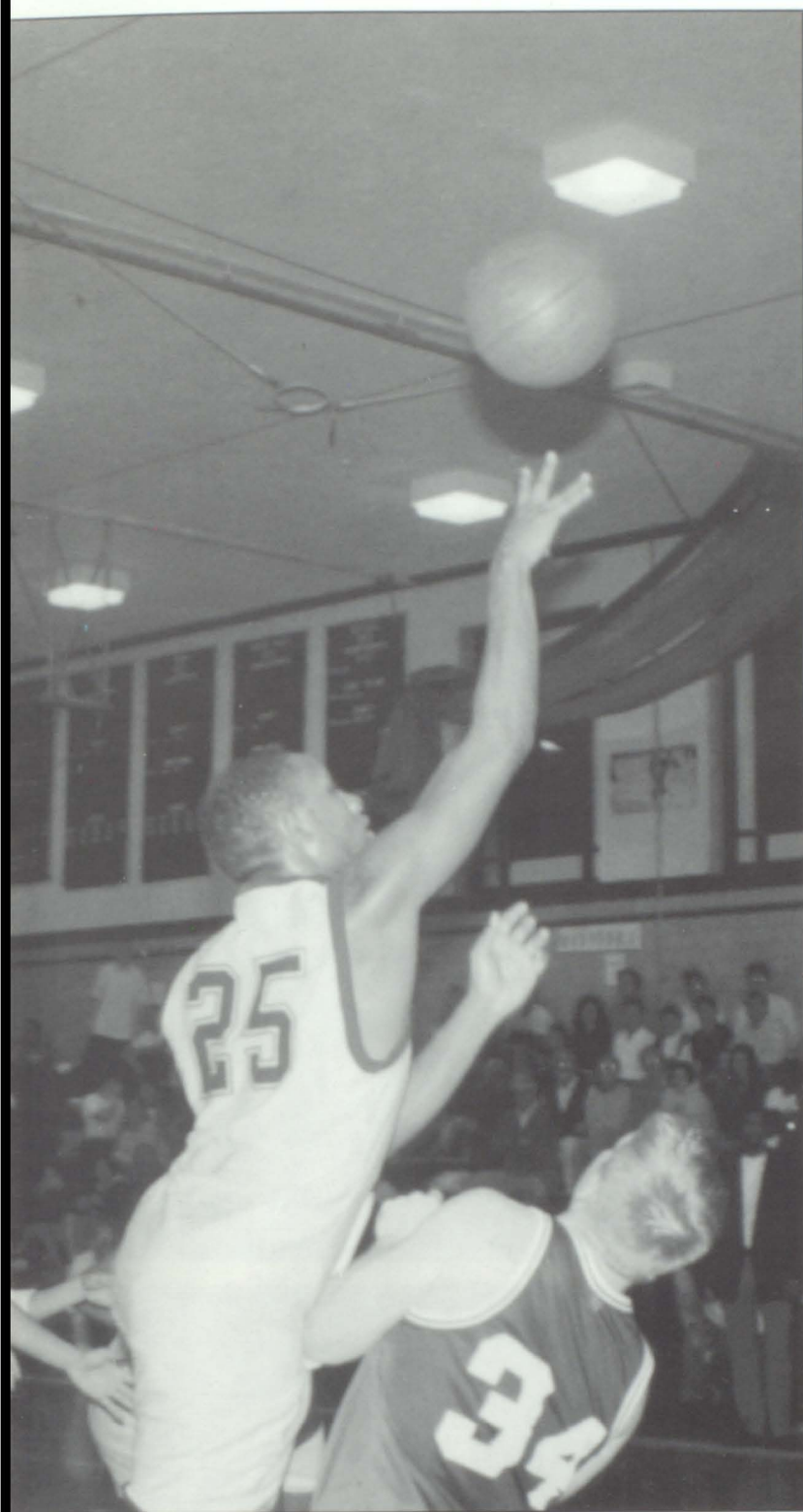

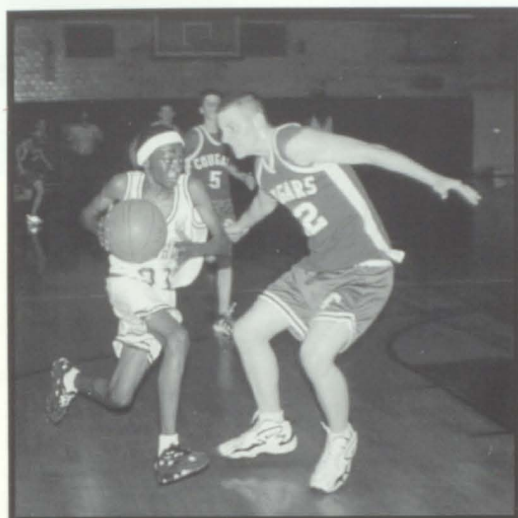

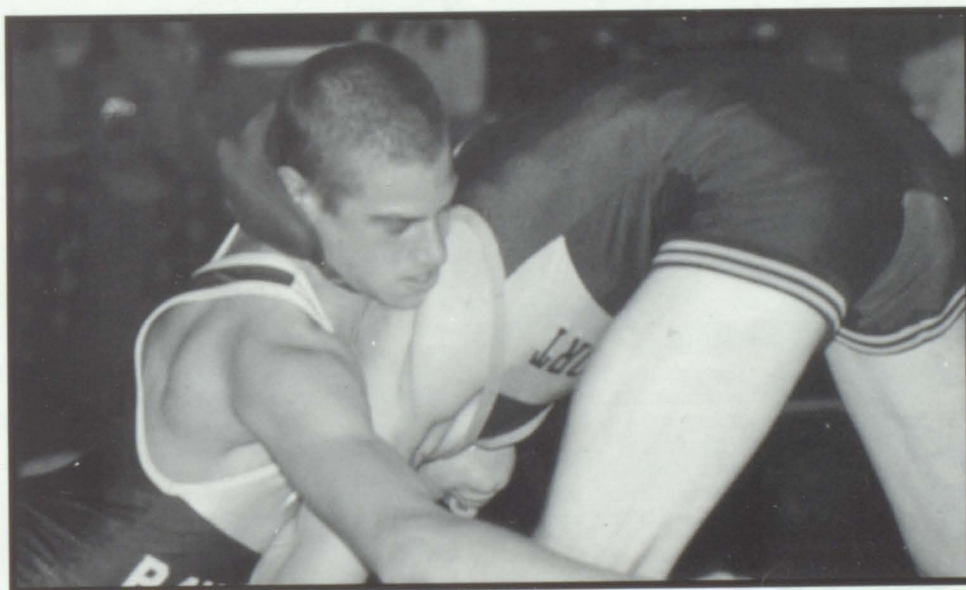

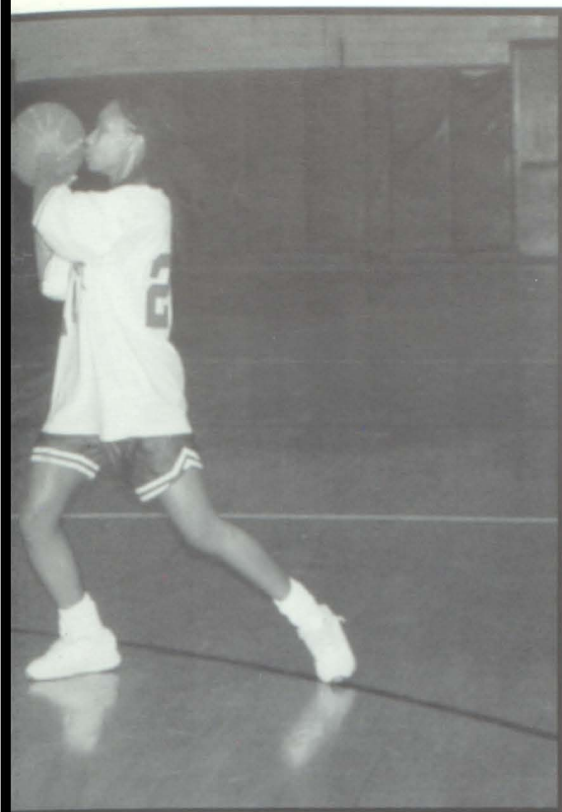

Co-captains of the Varsity team, Phil McLean and Joe LaManna, with the

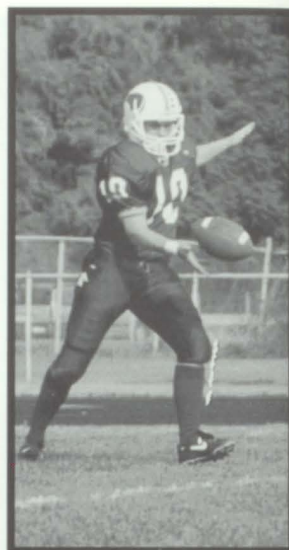

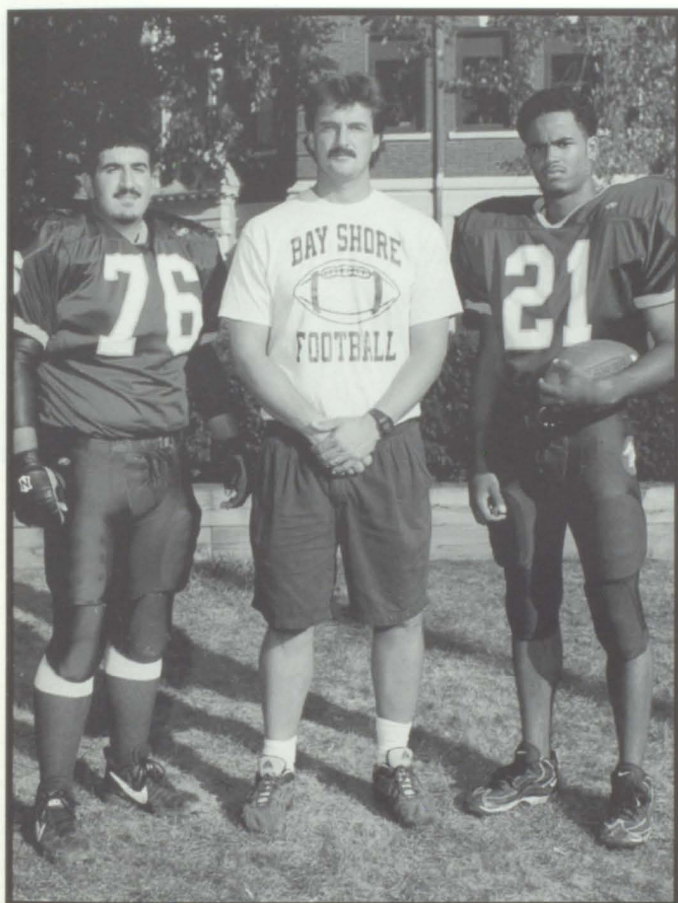

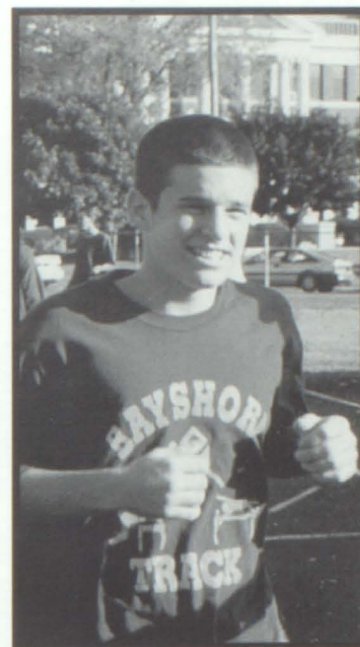

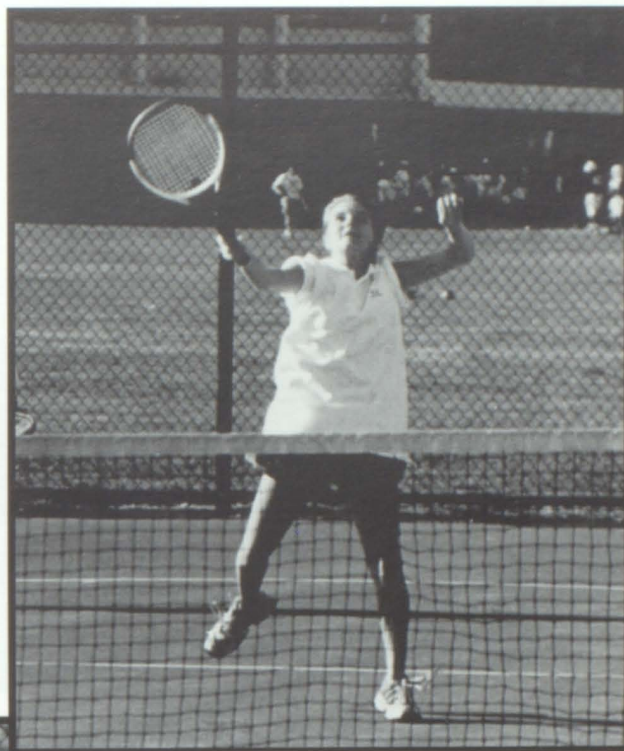

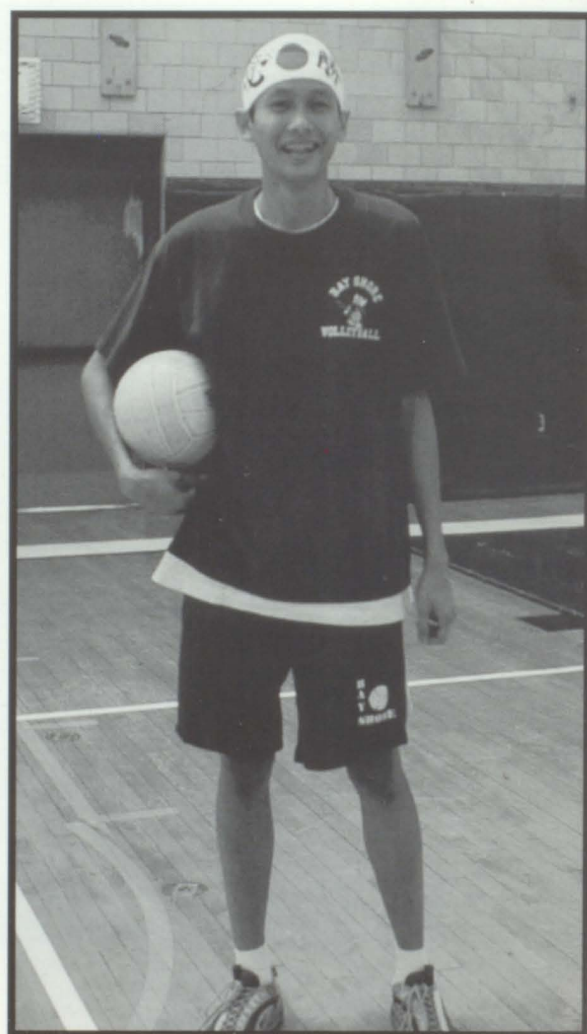

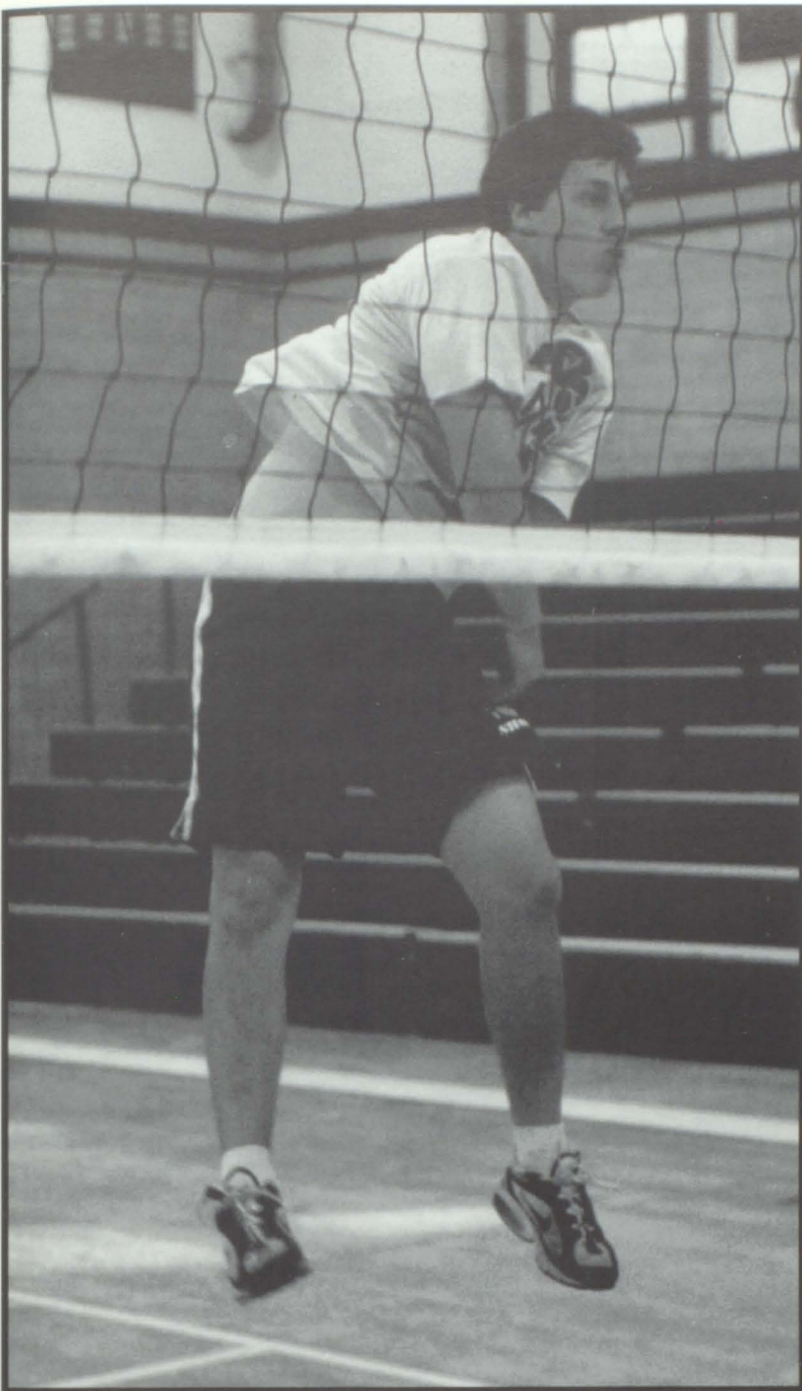

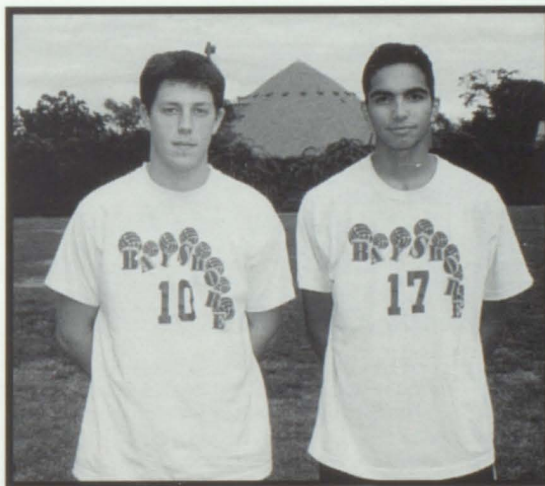

"We've had a very good team that was always trying its best. One thing I've always told them was to relax, have fun, and enjoy the moment," stated coach Mr. B. Mahler.

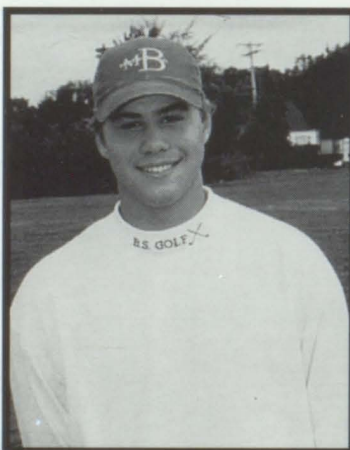
Victoriously, by the

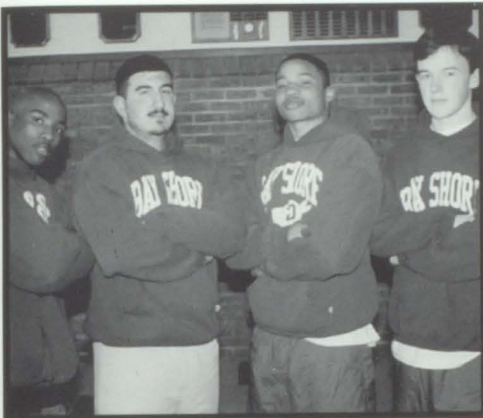

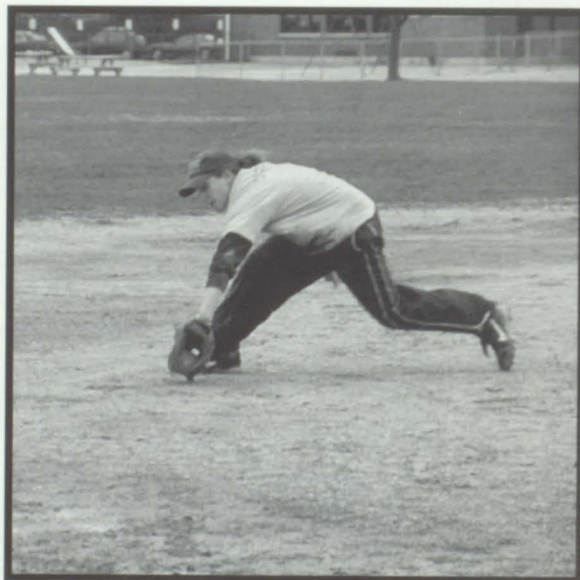
"The goal of the team was to put 100% into their work and succeed at doing well." said assistant coach Mr. J. McGowan, Jr.

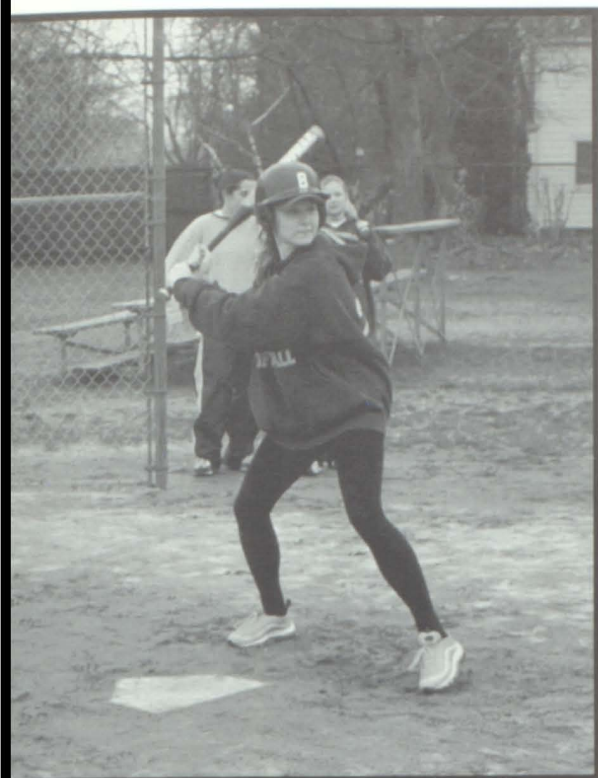

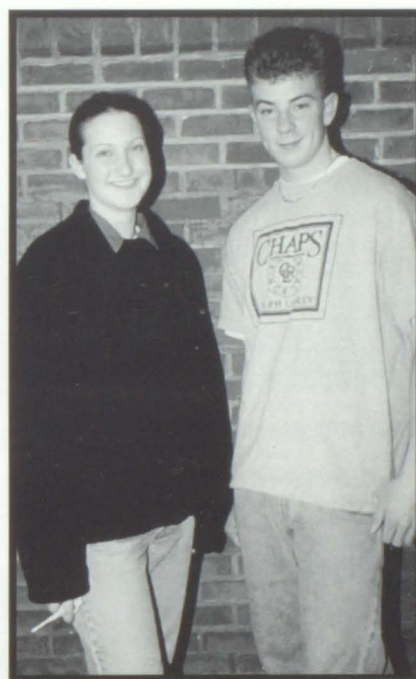

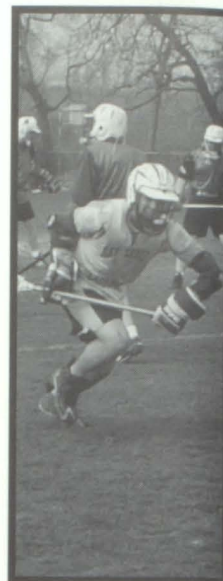
With lacrosse balls flying across the field and the crisp sounds of pads cracking, the lacrosse players entered into another season all fired up.

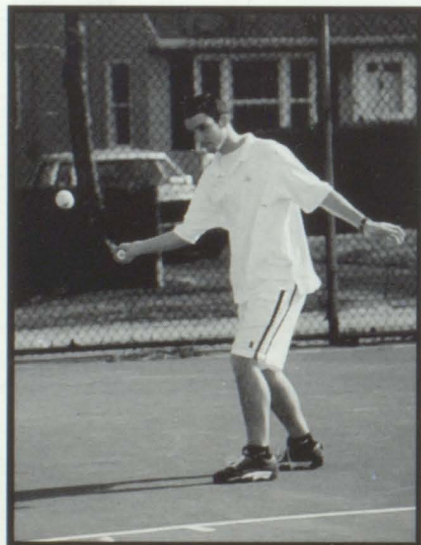

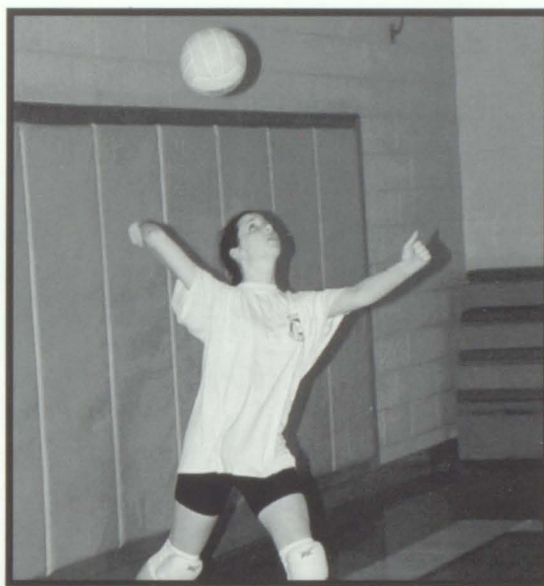

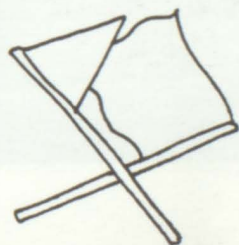

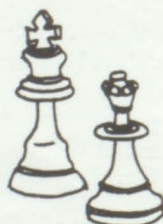

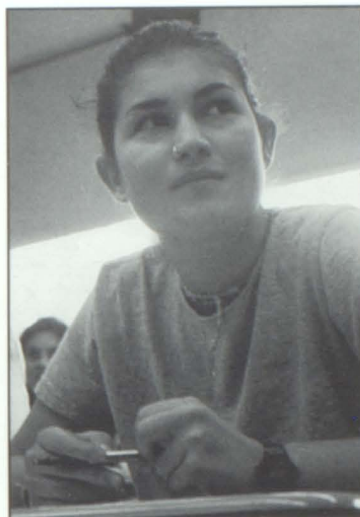

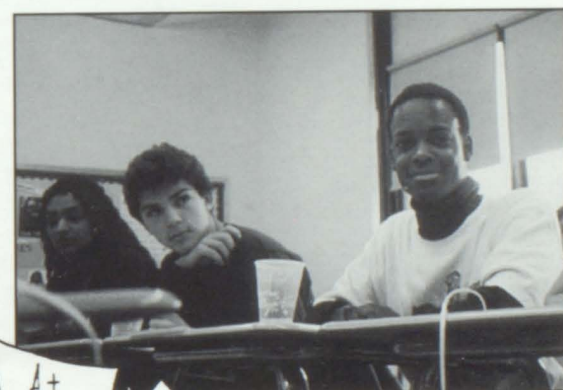

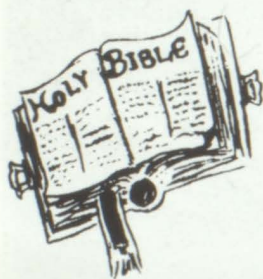

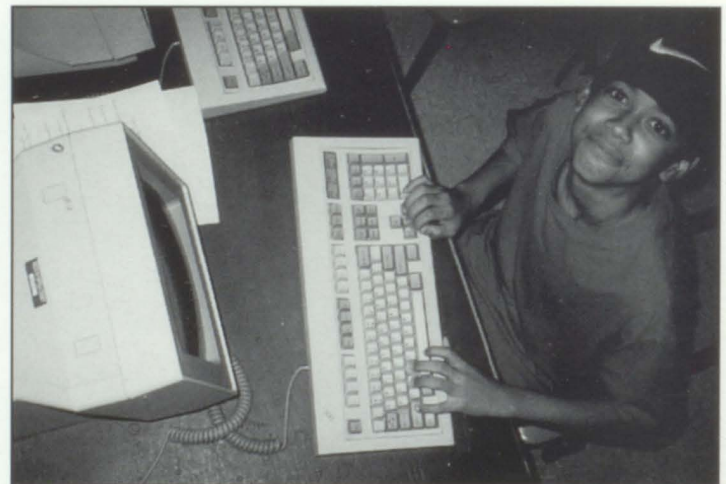
While the students sat around they shared computer strategies and stories and talked about the latest games that they had mastered. They enjoyed the camaraderie and looked forward to the weekly gatherings.

The Environmental Club worked hard all year to make the environment cleaner and more attractive.

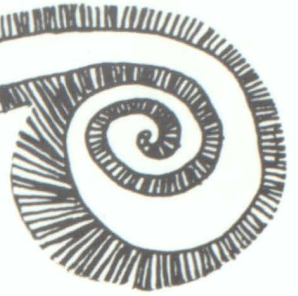

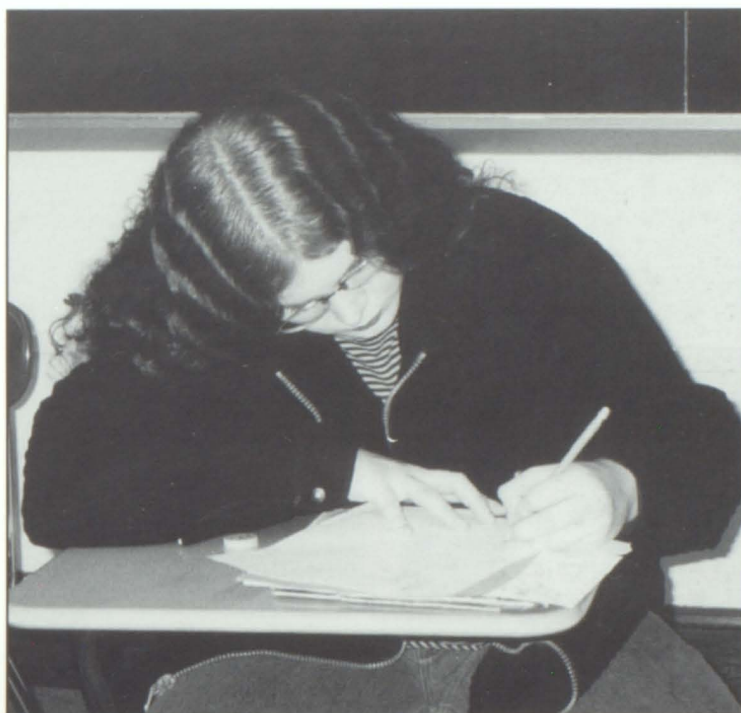

AIDS EDUCATORS



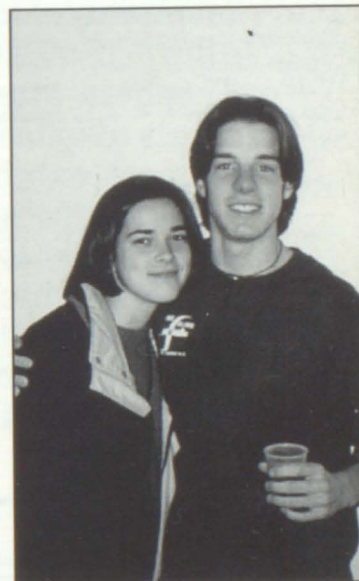
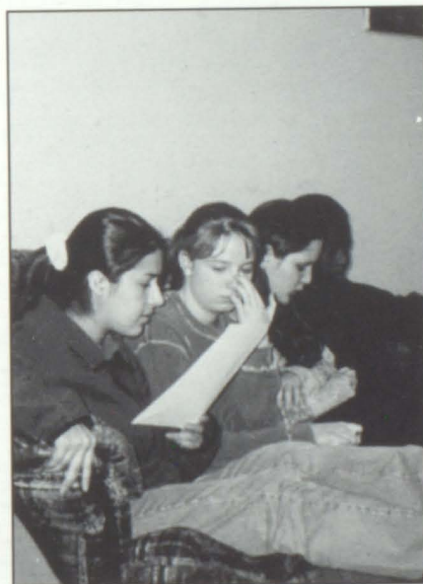

Academics In the Classroom

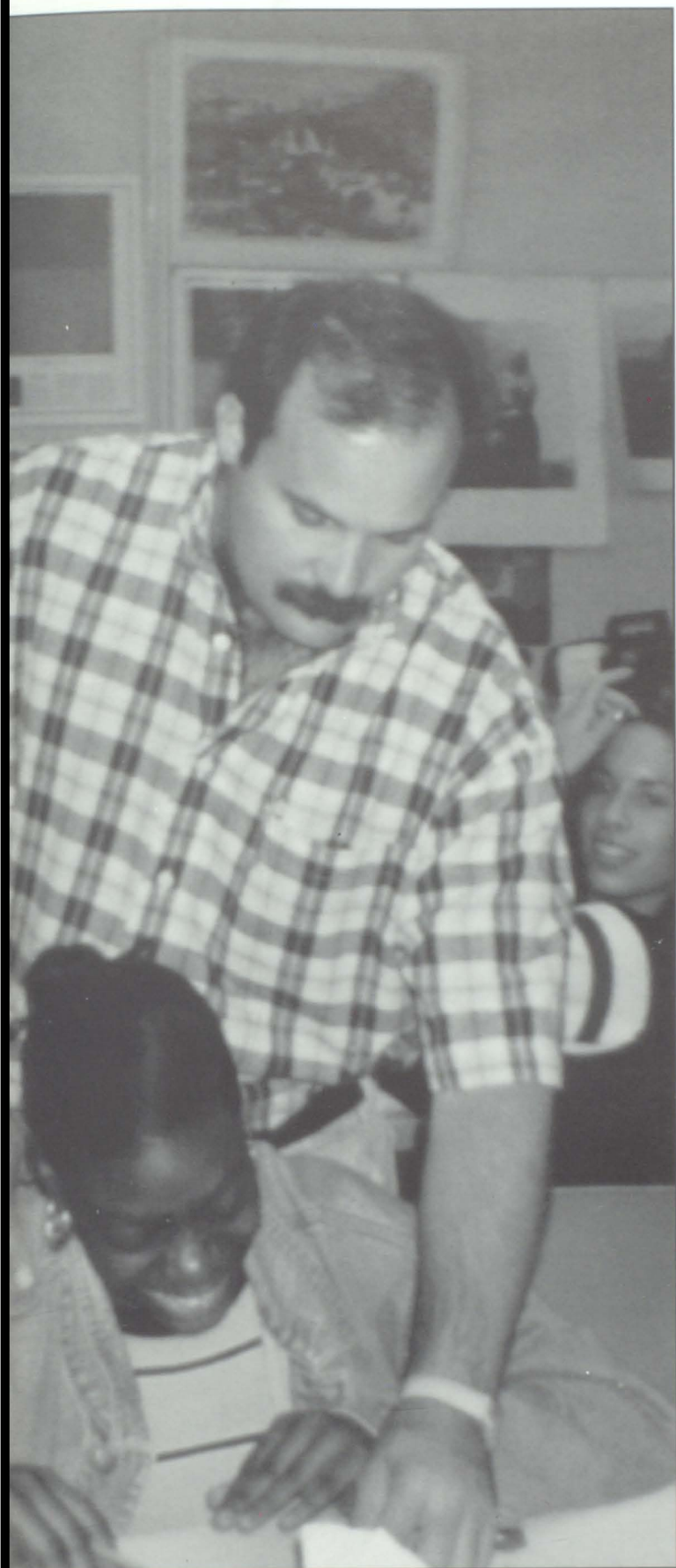

Art Club

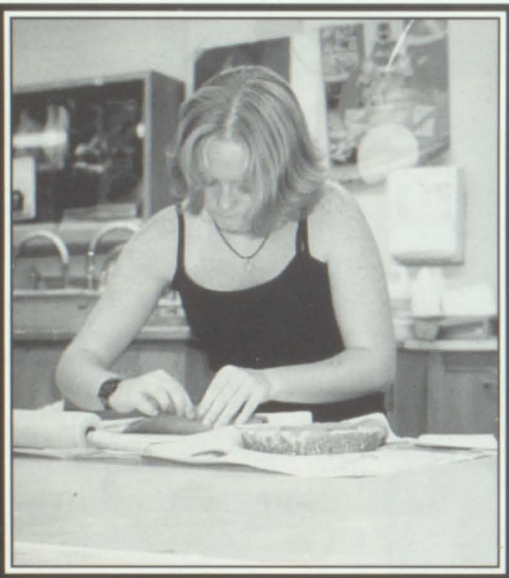
Colorful moments

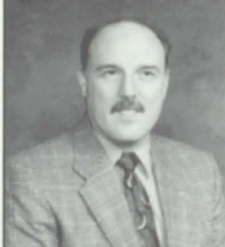

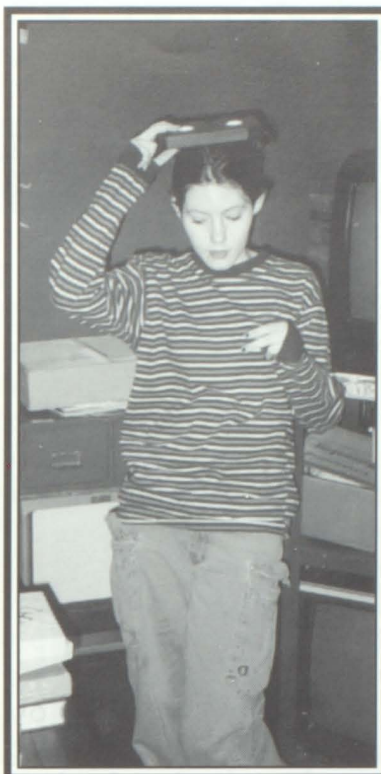
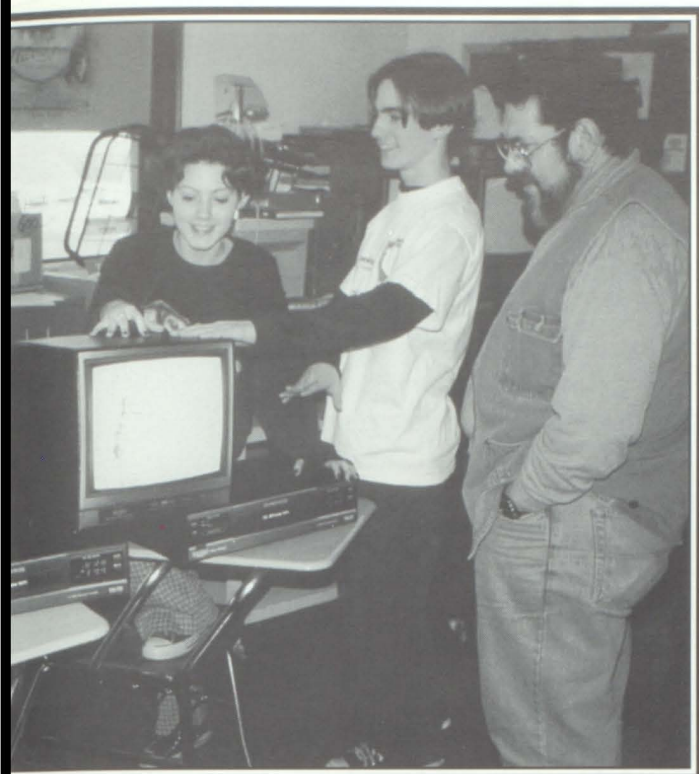
Many of the members hoped that their involvement and training would help them in college or in the pursuit of a career.

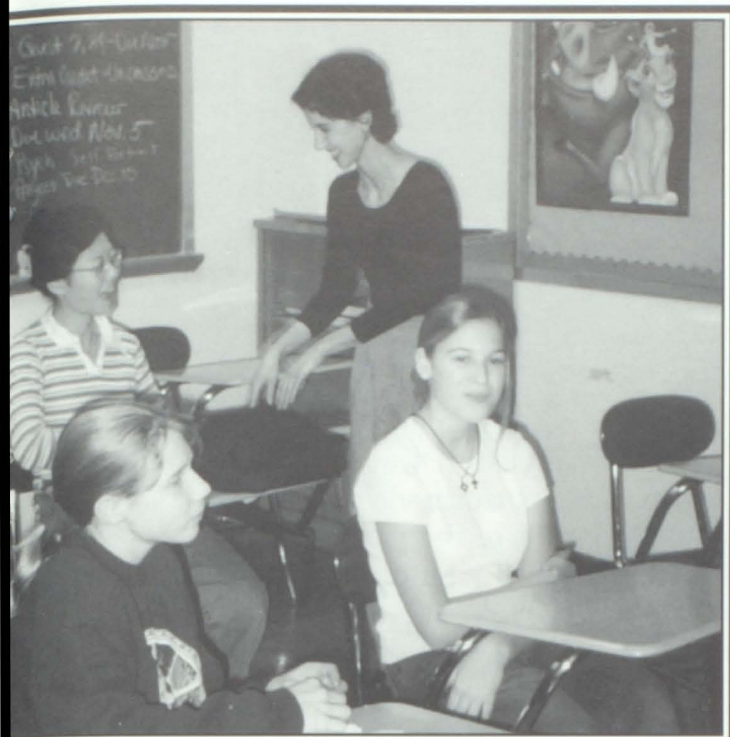

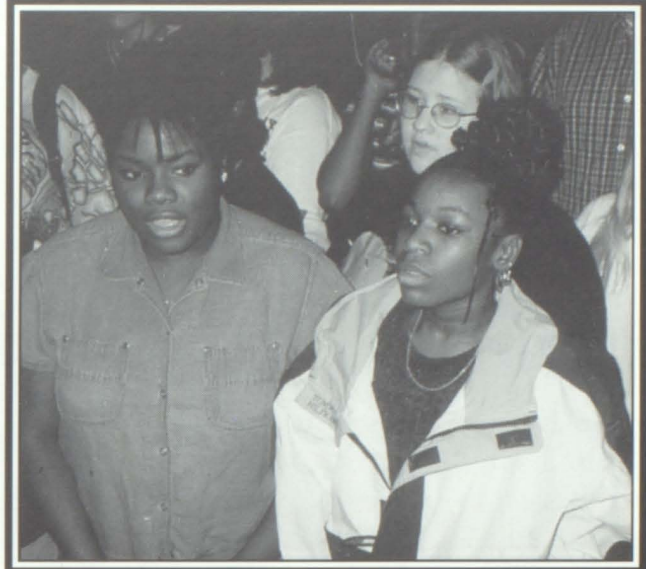

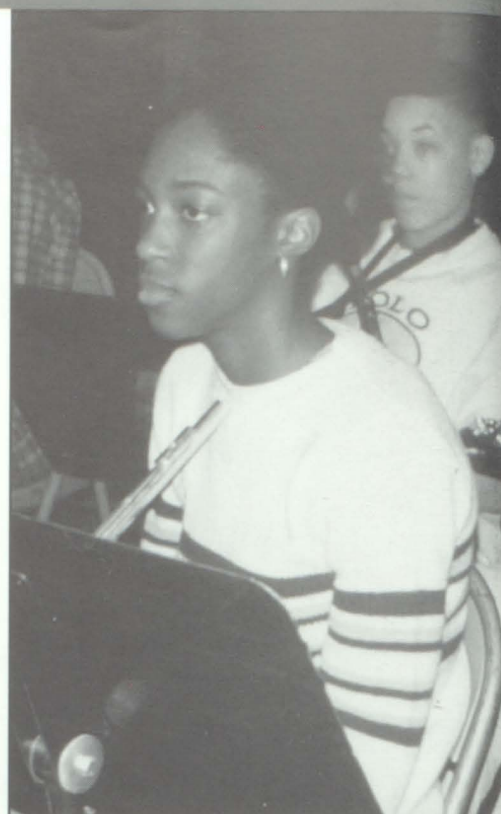
Magical Music Moments

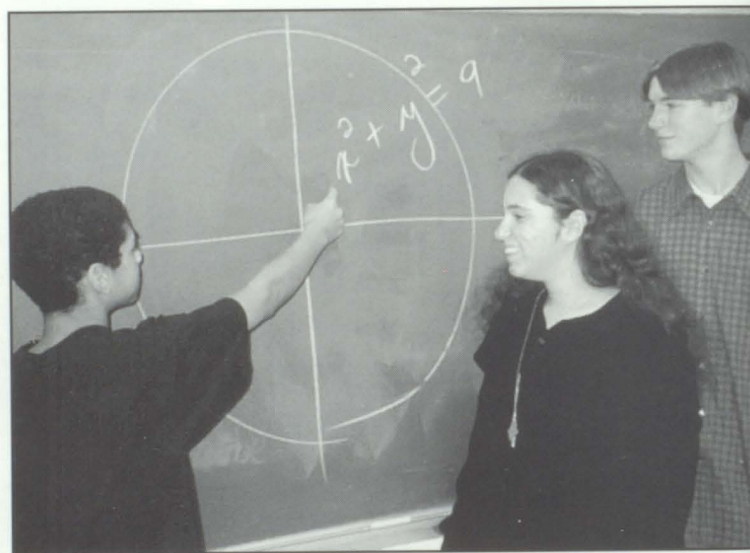

One More Year Left!

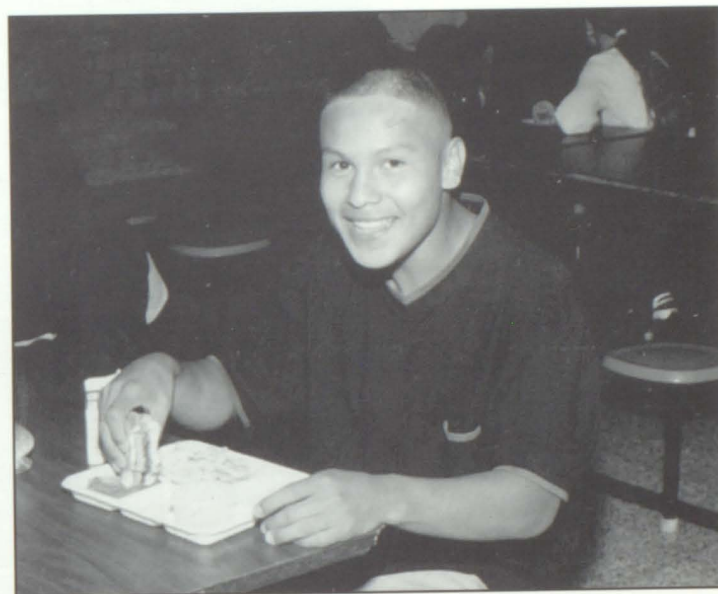

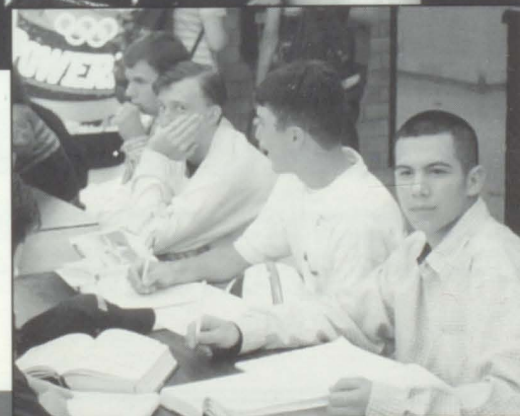
