building for a few more hours to participate in various club meetings, rehearsals, or practices, instead of getting on the bus and heading straight home.

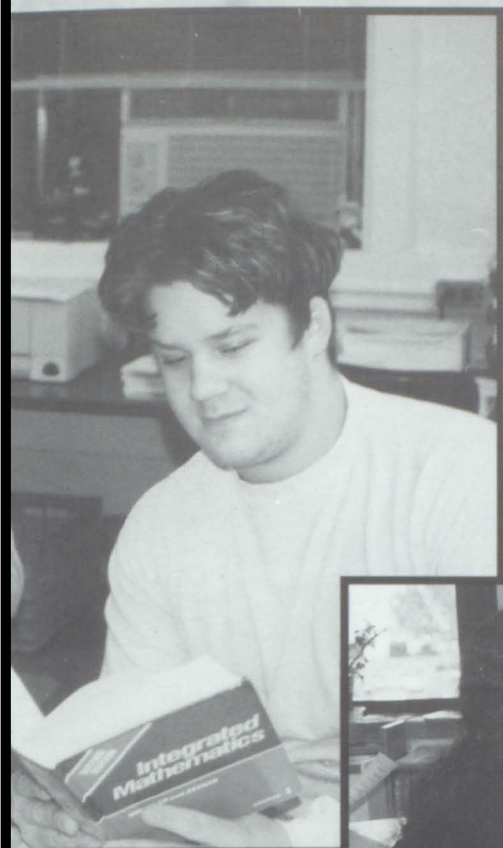

Every Tuesday, from two to three in the afternoon, seven young men worked diligently towards perfection on the projects of their choice. The students involved in Creative Writing Club cast their ideas into each other's hearts, reflected ideas from their minds, and shared the best laughs imaginable.

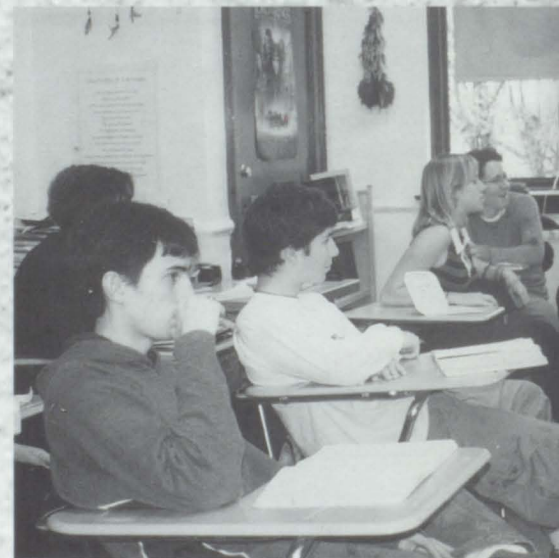

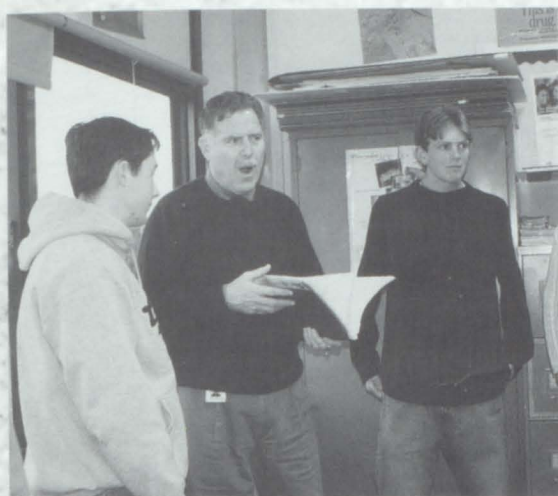

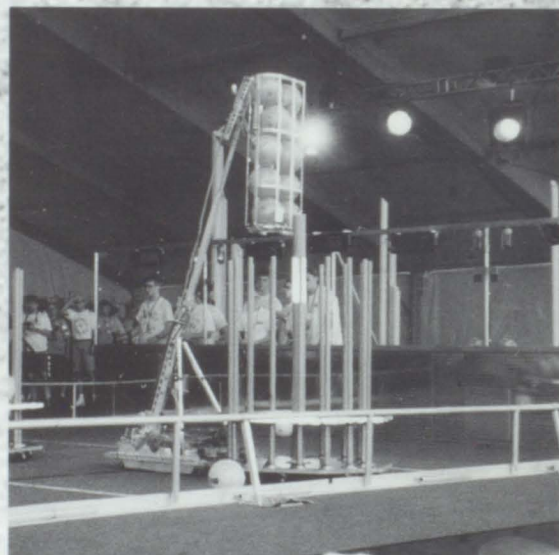

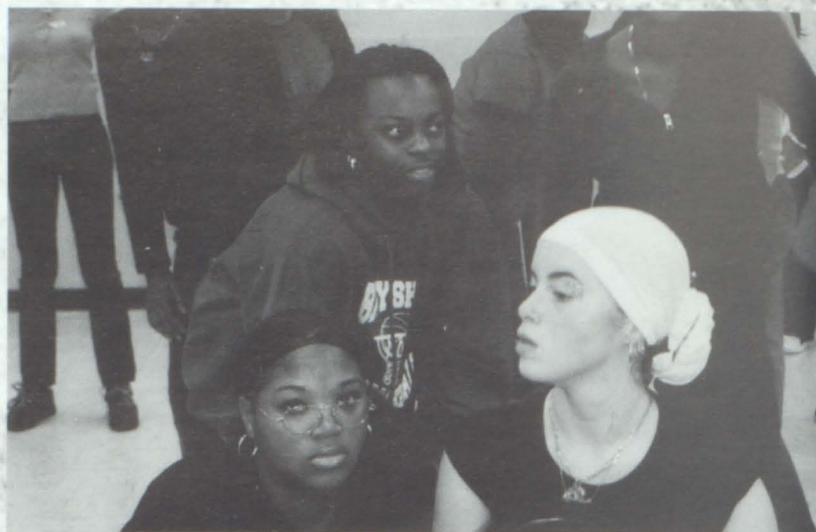

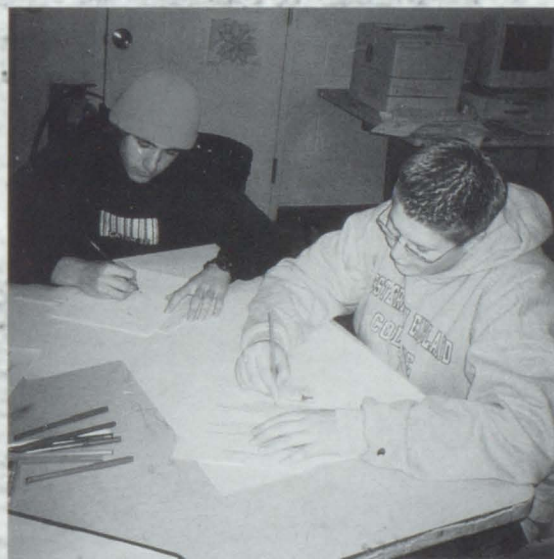

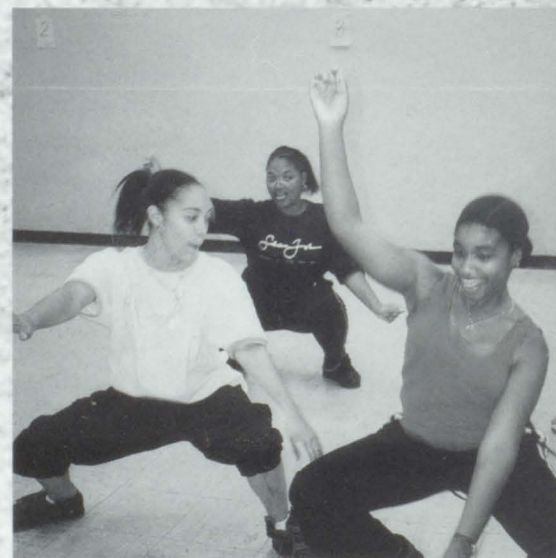

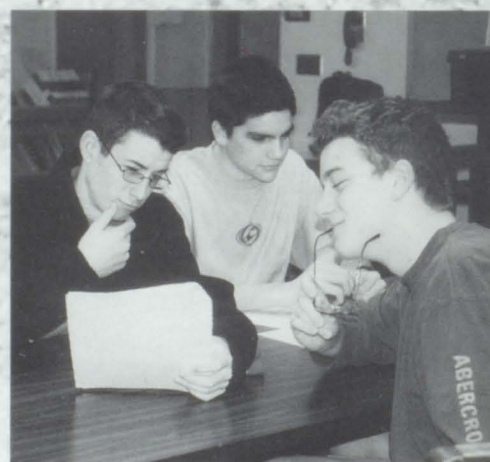

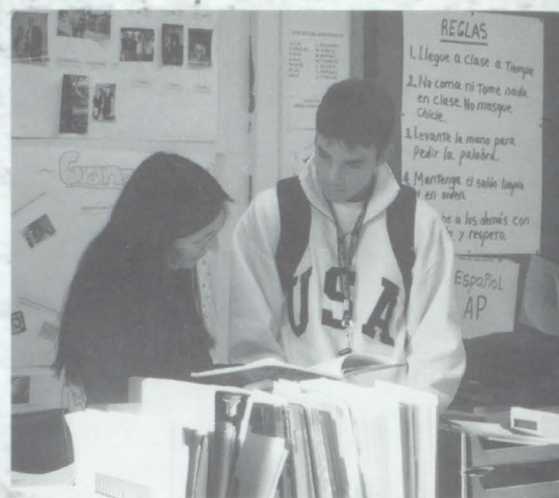

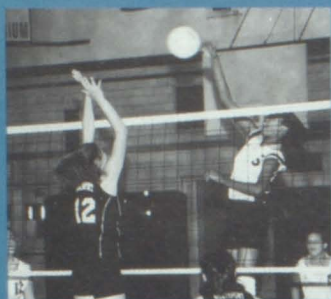

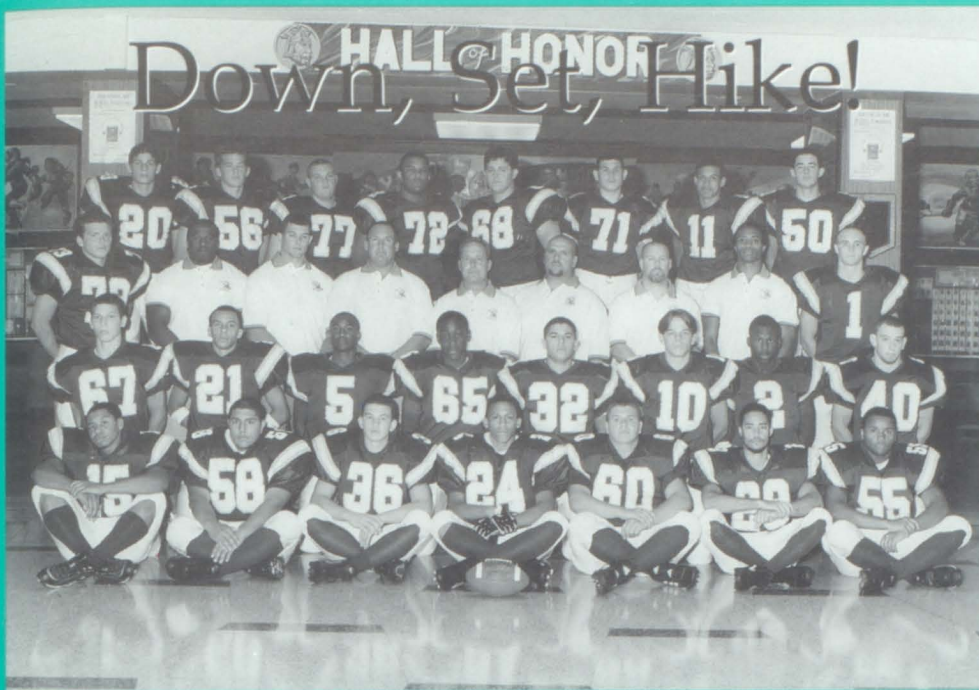

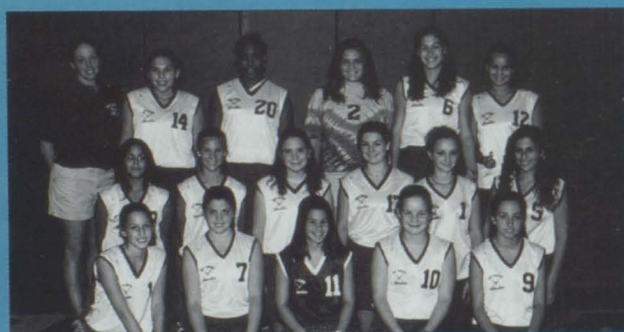

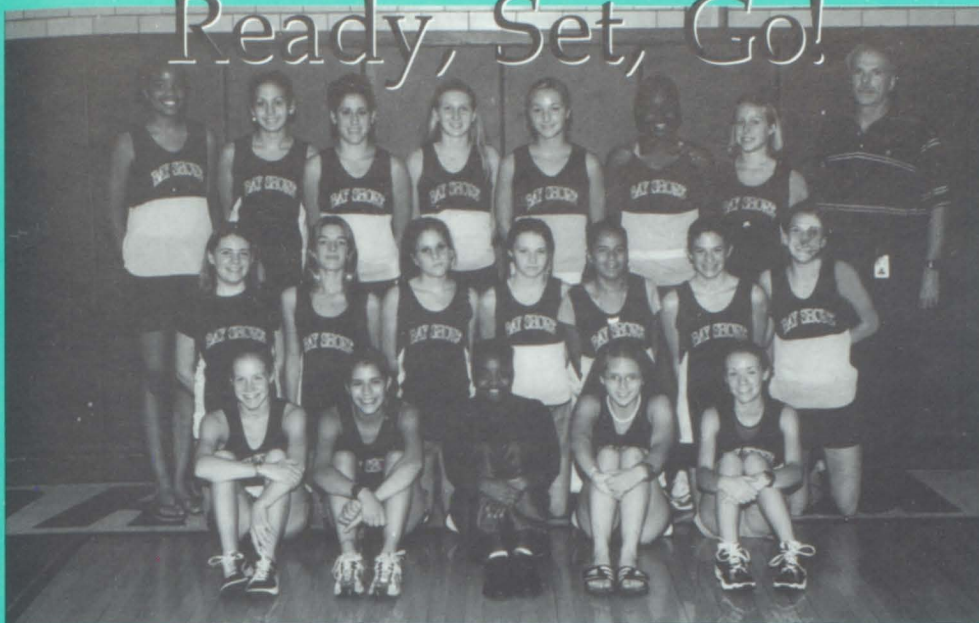

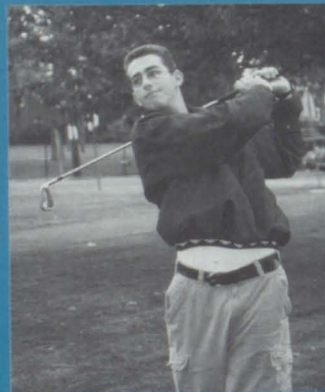

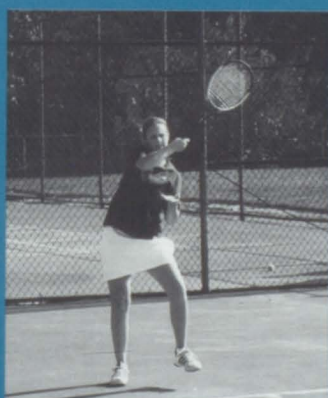
GIRLS TENNIS

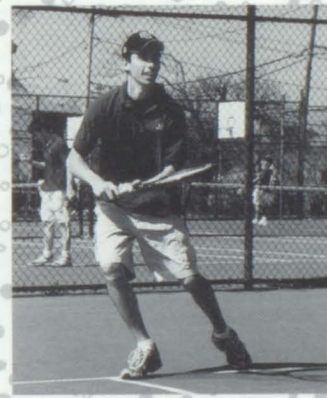

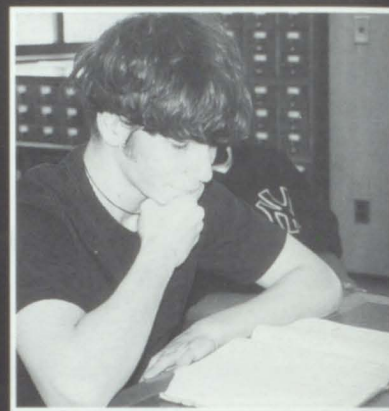
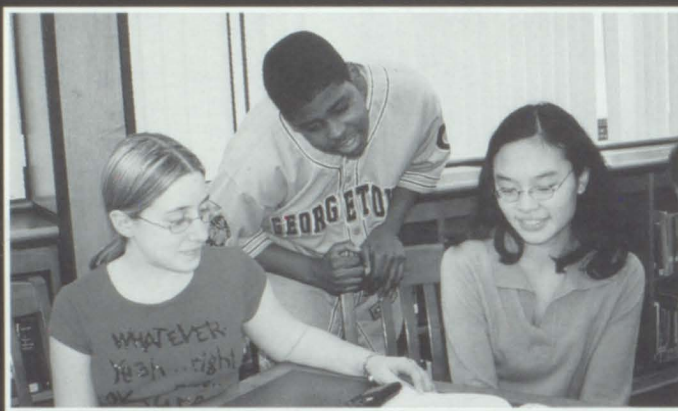
Crunching the Numbers

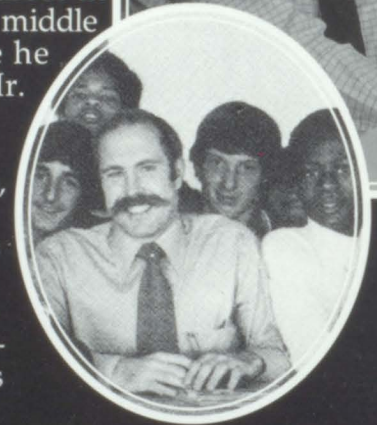
Mr. R. Rosener

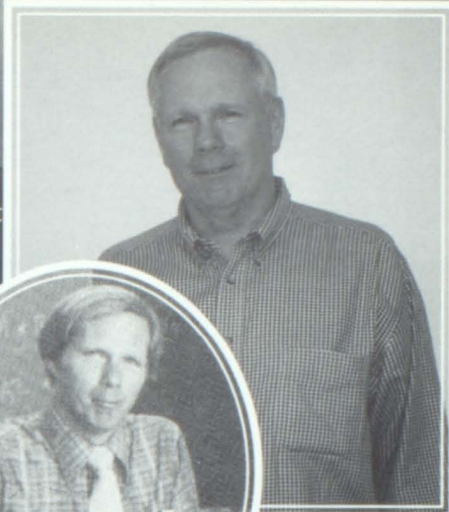
Mr. D. McGilvray

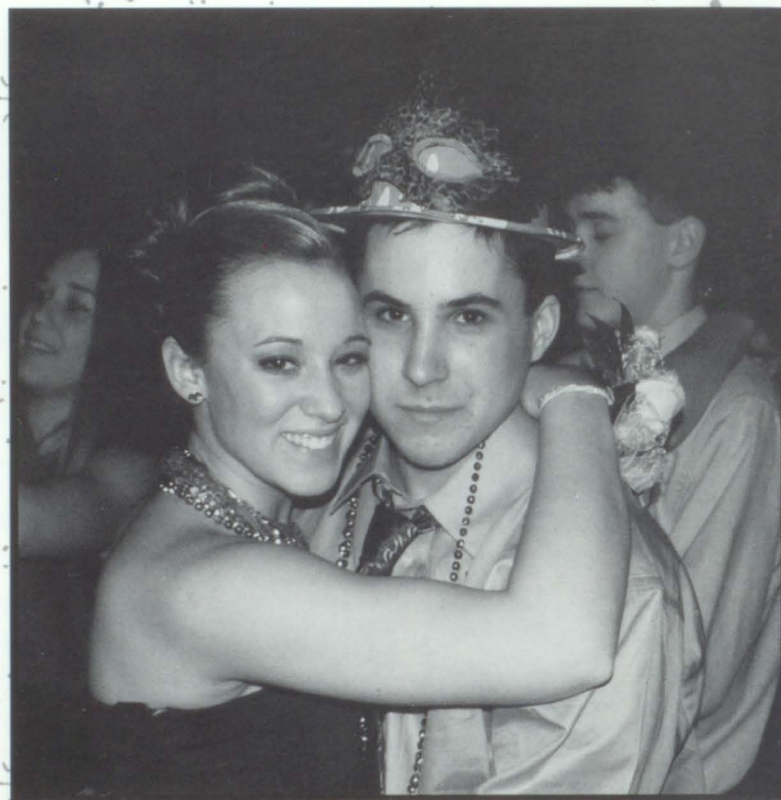

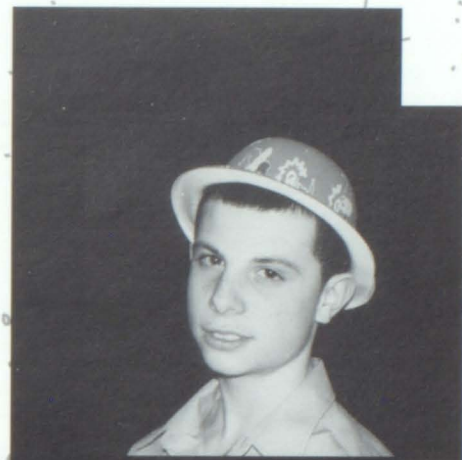

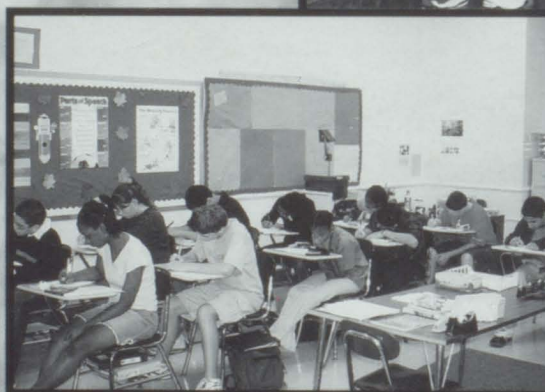

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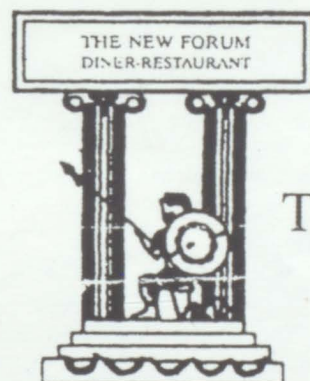
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Colophon and Closing

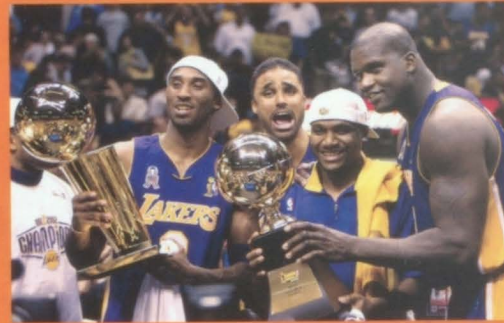
