
developed their education. They transformed from high school students to intelligent, college bound young adults.







Dance Club





The Peer Support team evolved into a group of mature, caring, diverse, and well-known young adults both in the school and in the community.










Awareness Weekend

McGowan also explained that his goal is for every student to experience one Awareness Weekend before they leave high school. It has proven to be a memory not soon forgotten.







Boys Soccer






Cheerleading

Football










Boys Golf








Girls Golf





Although, the adviser changed, the National Honor Society members have proved themselves to be the epitome of the well-rounded student.







The Mock Trial team has been, and still is the backbone of the law program at Bay Shore. The interest grows and the team gets better every year.







Since January 1972, Mrs. Patricia Ponzi has been a proud member of the Bay Shore High School Staff. Joining the staff in the middle of the year as a replacement teacher, she immediately became a well-respected and loved teacher. She worked through her first few years of teaching with ease, despite the challenges that usually affect new teachers. In addition, Mrs. Ponzi had to deal with the added pressure of facing her first year of teaching alone, as her husband was in the Marine Corp and stationed across the country in California. However, she persevered with the help of Mr. Bill Von Novak, the chairperson of the Social Studies Department at the time, and her mentor, Mr. Robert Mohr.

When asked what she thought was the best part of teaching, without hesitation, she responded, "The kids without a doubt! I felt at home here. Never did I doubt my choice to be here. Under the guidance of adviser Ms. Kelly Cuozzo, the staff was successful in making the 2004 Marauder a masterpiece that will withstand the test of time.


