



























In English class, students were always able to have a fun time while learning. Whether it was doing a project in Critics Choice, acting out Romeo and Juliet in 9th grade, making music videos in Film Studies, English teachers continuously

incorporated fun into their curriculum.

For example, Film Studies is a senior elective English class that encourages students to study film in the same way literature is studied. They look at what society was like during the release of a film, as well as what was happening

historically at the time.

"Something I look forward to seeing is when the Math teachers dress up," said Alyssa Leonard, junior. "I think it really shows their sense of humor."




"Law Day is our annual intramural mock trial competition," said Marziliano. "Each year over 100 students

"Its like having France in your own classroom," said Megan O'Donovan, junior. "We put out all the foods and then served the administrators, teachers and students like we were actually in France."









The final project requires students to bring in a visual and prepare a ten minute oral presentation on the


topic of their choice. Some of the most popular topics were drug and alcohol abuse, cancer, and eating disorders.

"This year it wasn't about 'I', it was about 'we.'" said Rose McCallister, senior.






The team was tighter than ever before and possessed a confident attitude, which helped to carry them far into the playoffs. Everyone loved to play and worked hard to go far into the playoffs.



Christian Molinar, senior, intercepts a pass and aims it back to the offensive side of the field.











gym until all team and personal goals were achieved for the day. With such dedication, they were a force to be reckoned with.










"Out of my 11 years of coaching, this was the most competitive team I've ever had," said Mr. John Carney, coach and Business teacher.

"During the off season, many of us played at Deer Park, Southward Ho, or took private lessons," said David Melstner, senior and co-captain. "This really helped us prepare for the season."



The team believes that its recent success is only the beginning for Bay Shore Wrestling.







This was a year when freshmen truly excelled, with Kadesh Roberts being ranked the top-ranked freshman for long jump.


"Our team has a bright future ahead of it," added Viteri. "We surpassed our opponents with strength, cooperation and perseverance."







With support from fans, family and friends, and valuable tactics from the coaches, victory was sure to come.





Last year, the girls varsity four boat was ranked fourth in









Student Government




"I think it is important for us to get all the ideas of the students out around the school so they feel they have a say in what goes on," said senior class President Michael Barreda.


Each grade had its own president who represented their class. There was also a Student Council president Sebastian Navas, who represented the entire student body.

"I am proud to be part of the National Honor Society," said Dr. Bill Herbst, adviser and Latin Teacher.


Along with Mr. Dan Tonsetic, Dr. Herbst organized and ran the National Honor Society.

"This is a great club because it helps you give back to your community," said Brianna Harrison, sophomore. "Meanwhile, you're really giving back to yourself."





"It helps our students learn compassion," said Ms. Margaret Shultz,



"Every year we go to the city," said Doug Zangre, senior and president of Tri-M.


The students and adviser have many aspiring dreams for Tri-M.


"I love jazz, I really do," said Jason Lombardo, senior. "And, it's the time where I can let loose and really have fun with the music."







Many of the students who participated in Art Club had their own


sketchbooks and created art on their own time as well.





The club put on several poetry jams throughout the year and released a major publication, "The Writers Block," a collection of poems and short stories showcasing work by club members.


This was a place for those interested in furthering their mind through writing and looking at the world through new perspectives.



"Lyrical Ensemble has helped me become active in the school and go to events I normally wouldn't go to," said Michelle Loehle, sophmore.


With the help of the Arts Education Fund, Advisor Ms. Michelle Denino hopes to offer master classes in more styles.

"We would like to change the climate of the school to include greener ideas," explained Ms. Ward.


The club worked for the greater good and went to extreme lengths to clean up our school, gaining more members than ever, helping to improve the quality of its actions.


"This club was created to provide a supportive environment to work on films and to keep cinematic enthusiasm going even after school," said Ms. Kalter.

"Film club is so much fun," said Ashley Komoroski, senior. "I am so glad we had a club like this at Bay Shore. Everyone should have joined."





"Business is not only a future career," said Ms. Taylor. "It's also keeping ahead of the money game."



Debating became a way for the students to organize their thoughts and opinions on many current issues, such as the Presidential election.


"In the heat of one of the most historic elections ever, debating for your favorite candidate made you feel like you had an impact on the upcoming election," said Erin Dalo, senior.


occur in school were brought up and discussed.





Along with a weekend of fun comes hard, yet rewarding, work," said Ms. Shannon Handley, co-adviser and English teacher.





The cast and crew attended mandatory long and tedious rehearsals, but had fun doing it.


