




"The school was very into it," said Christian Katzer, senior. "Each class was excited to represent their color and to claim the title of most spirit."






"Sports Camp is without a doubt the most fun job a high school student can have," said McCarthy. "What could be more fun than playing sports with kids all day?"

Connor Chrisman, senior, another employee at the YMCA also enjoys his job of playing sports with children.


"Sports camp is fun. We play games all day. Dodgeball is the number one sport that we play and the kids love it when we play counselors vs. campers."

The YMCA building sits right in the heart of downtown Bay Shore and is home to many of the jobs held by Bay Shore High School students.




"My favorite childhood memory was playing the Super Mario video games and I thought that, done correctly, it could make a really good costume," Scott Audette, senior.





"An event always takes a lot of planning, but this one especially because we had to reschedule it due to the snow," said Ms. Side.


Despite the bad weather that occurred on the rescheduled date as well, the senior class appeared to have a great time.

"I was freaking out about getting ready for college," said Kerry Moore, senior. "But Ms. Ehlers really helped me out and made the process so much easier."


The college application process is so much more than just assembling the application and forwarding it to the schools.

Other than this project, many other classes are offered to students to allow them to express their creativity in ways that interest them.




"I think the new curriculum is going to make it easier for the newcomers because it's innovative, manageable, and doesn't cram all classes into one," said Michael Mauro, senior.


Each of these classes has a matching Regents exam that will be taken at the end of the appropriate year, allowing students to study for a smaller amount of content for each exam.

"I'm glad I don't have to remember all of the math B1 material over the summer anymore," said Stephanie Ellwood, Sophomore.





"I like evolution because of the things it teaches us for the future, and all of our future health purposes," said Onica Sibley, sophomore.


Evolution is more than just the theory behind the formation of man; it is the theory that describes the transition from one stage to another through changes and mutations.



"I was scared at first to go into the jail," said Carla Alberto, junior. "But it turned out to be a different experience than I thought it would be."


These trips help bring to life for students the many different facets of social studies.



"When the students performed at the French week assembly, it was exciting to see them sing and recite poems in French," said Janelle Hayslett, senior.


During these performances, students used their listening, reading, writing, and speaking skills.




Andrea Dunn, junior, shows her French class her presentation on a francophone country she researched. The projects helped to inform the class of the different cultures of French speaking countries.



There are many changes in the Music and Arts Department this year, including the new International Baccalaureate Music Program. Here, a small selection of juniors and seniors who have a passion for music and might want to pursue music later in life can advance their knowledge.

"IB Music not only teaches college level music theory, but also includes music history, music composition, ear training, solo performance, and the study of world music," said Mr. Ed Schaefer, Music teacher.



Health


Health class, a required course for all students, can also be one of the interesting and valuable. Students learn about topics ranging from drug use, to diet, to disease.







Joni McLaughlin



All the coaches agreed that they would not have made it to the playoffs without the leadership skills of Mike Lifavi, senior and captain.



"From the summer until November we became a family," said Derrell Sains, senior. "Through wins and losses, we learned how to stick together because that's what helps you get through the good and the bad."






Dwayne Sains makes a run for a touchdown, while Michael Moore blocks for him. Dwayne Sains had two receptions for 27 yards in this game.

Mike Lifavi and the team members walk onto the field after halftime. Lifavi had 8 tackles in the game against Centereach.




Griffin Rock prepares to hike the ball to quarterback Michael Moore. Griffin Rock was one of four sophomores who made the varsity team.




"We we were motivated by our desire to beat the girls field hockey team," said Ben Schuman, senior.


The boys cross country team choreographed a dance to the song 'I need a hero,' from the musical Footloose.

This family atmosphere was something that grew throughout the season, partly because of the amount of time spent with each other.




"The team learned how to have fun and compete at the same time," said Coach Jon Nelson.











"Getting the shirts really improved our morale going up against the difficult team: Lindenhurst," said Billy Cunningham, senior.



The team wound up with a strong win against Lindenhurst.

The team successfully completed these goals, but ultimately came up short, losing to Eastport Manor in the second round of playoffs.












Vazquez's teammates are sad to see one of their leaders go.


"It is very sad that Stephanie is leaving because she has added a lot to the team and we are all really going to miss her," said Mackenzie O'Connor, junior and captain.

Vasquez will be leaving behind a winning team and will look back at a growing program.







It was not easy to achieve this goal. The team practiced six days a week for three to four hours each day. They also participated in professional gymnastics throughout the year to improve their tumbling skills.




"We're a very tight, close family," said Karl Hall, senior. "There's a lot of team love."

"You can't fake hard work, whether it is in sports, or in life," said assistant coach, Mr. David Mayo.






An important goal for this season was to be victorious in their final meet.







"This season was the most stressful, yet rewarding one ,yet," said Steve Borbet, coach. "I am more than proud of the girls for stepping up the way they did in the end."




Nicole Chin, junior, clears the final hurdle during a victory in the 55 meter hurdle race. Chin's personal best this season in the event was 10.86 seconds.






According to Amber Atkins, senior, wrestling is not like other sports.

"It's the intensity," Atkins said. "We work really hard and we don't get many water breaks. It's the hardest workout I ever do."


Atkins also had a strong opinion on what students should know about wrestlers and wrestling in general.



Although the team has had many set backs, they have nevertheless remained as a team looking to increase their wins.


"My score has been increasing due to my practice and the influences of the coaches," said Stephanie Guevara, sophomore.



Earlier in the season, the boys were anxious about playing against West Islip, their biggest rival. They were determined to give it all they had, but they fell short 12-4.







This motto for the varsity Baseball team has become a phrase to remember. With this motto in mind, most of the graduating seniors will continue to use the action of playing baseball in college.



"This was a great accomplishment for me because something like this rarely happens," said Cruz.







With the money raised, two overnight meets were planned, the Red Raider Relays in North Rockland, NY and the Eddy Games in Schenectady, NY.


"I was really happy that we were able to still go on the away meets," said Darleen Eiremann, senior. "They're probably my favorite part of the season."

It is difficult to determine the strongest area of the boy's track team as there are strengths in many of the different track and field events.


"We pride ourselves on being a total team that can score in all phases of track and field," said Langer.


"We are really proud of our accomplishment and we are really happy that all of our hard work paid off," said Moore.

This year, the Girls Crew team has invested much of their time and strength to field a successful team.











"The most important event every year by far is the state championships upstate in Saratoga," said Reilly Moran, junior.



The twelve boys on the varsity tennis team range from 9th grade to 12th grade. Despite the gap in age, this close knit team has taken team bonding to a whole new level.


First year players Pat Phillips and Mike Lifavi, seniors, came up with the idea of playing team sports after practice.

In the past, many students would do one type of service that would be used to meet the hour requirements. The new criteria forces students to do many different types of community service activities.







The students had a positive reaction to the new advisor.





school musicians.





"In the future, I want to be a better cook for my family," said Khristy Laguerre, senior.




















Second year advisor, Mr. Michael Hochman, is thrilled at how the program has developed.








1. Turn off the lights when no one's in the room.


