






Bay Shore Varsity Football snagged a win at their Homecoming game this year. It was their first win of the season and very exciting for Bay Shore.







## Goal of the Year











## Back On The Rise






## Suffolk Semifinals




# THE HIPPEST KATZ

Senior Superlatives: Ballot sheets were distributed to all seniors. Only sheets that were turned in were counted, and nearly 40% of the seniors turned in votes.


