Dear Bay Shore-Brightwaters Community,

The Library staff and Board of Trustees would like to thank you for your patience and cooperation during the past year as we continued to modify our policies and services in accordance with the latest laws and guidance on the COVID-19 pandemic.

We have learned that some of the modifications we made including curbside pickup, curbside crafts, and virtual programs offer additional convenience to you and will likely remain a permanent part of the regular service we provide.

Presently, as the number of COVID-19 cases has dramatically declined and most mandates have been lifted we are hopeful that your future experiences at the Library will be accompanied by a renewed feeling of normalcy.

At the same time the Library recognizes the need to address the ongoing impact of the pandemic on the community. We will continue to explore and offer additional resources especially in the areas of personal finance, employment, education, mental and physical health.

The Library is asking that you continue to support our mission to provide you with the excellent library service you expect and deserve. The Library Board and staff have collaborated to create a proposed budget that will continue to offer you the highest level of service possible at a reasonable cost. We are pleased to report that the proposed budget increase is below this year's tax cap.

VOTER INFORMATION

Who can Vote? Anyone who is:

- 1. At least 18 years of age.
- 2. A citizen of the United States.
- 3. A resident of the Bay Shore Union Free School District for at least 30 days.
- 4. Registered with the Suffolk County Board of Elections or the Board of Registration of the Bay Shore Union Free School District.

Registration is required if a person has not voted within four years in a general, school or library election. Voting status may be confirmed by calling the District Clerk at 631-968-1117.

After finding refuge from the Nazis in America, a brother and sister return to their native Germany in 1945, as the Allied occupation begins. Mostly set in a bombed-out, black-market-driven, postwar Berlin, The Living and the Lost brims with a spot-on timeliness in its concern about the lasting damage of a culture of hatred while delivering a riveting look at the days and months leading up to the building of the Berlin Wall, its consequences and its lasting impact on individuals.

Ellen Feldman, an Amagansett, Long Island resident and 2009 Guggenheim fellow, has written 9 novels, including Scottsboro, The Boy Who Loved Anne Frank and Paris Never Leaves You.


















In addition to these free passes, the Library offers discounted tickets to the Bronx Zoo, Splish Splash and the Long Island Aquarium.
