


A YEAR IN REVIEW...2022



BAY SHORE-BRIGHTWATERS PUBLIC LIBRARY **PROPOSED BUDGET** 2023-2024

Dear Bay Shore-Brightwaters Community,

There was a palpable feeling of joyous normalcy at the Library this past year as our community emerged from the COVID-19 Pandemic. The Library staff and the Board of Trustees restored normal Library operations and welcomed our patrons back. Once again the majority of our programs were attended in person, children played and parents mingled in our children's room, civic and social groups gathered in the community rooms and students of all ages occupied the study rooms.

The joy of normalcy was accompanied by our excitement and eagerness to complete initiatives and start new projects that had to be put on hold during the height of the pandemic. As part of our ongoing commitment to improve the Library for your safety and enjoyment we successfully completed several projects during the last year. The parking lot was renovated and re-paved. New exterior lighting was installed featuring attractive lamp posts and energy efficient LED lights. Safety bollards were installed in the parking lot in front of the east exterior wall of the Library. The community rooms received a fresh coat of paint and the aging and worn carpeting was replaced with attractive and cost effective carpet tiles which can be individually replaced if damaged or stained. Over the next year we plan to continue replacing worn carpet throughout the Library.

In addition Library staff from several departments recently completed a thorough evaluation of the adult fiction collection. Visit the Upper Level Stacks and you will find a collection that is now attractive and browseable, with new spine labels that are easy to read. We have now begun the same project with our nonfiction collection in the Lower Stacks.

Finally as part of our commitment to ensure that the Library and ultimately, our community continues to thrive in the future we have joined the nationally recognized Sustainable Libraries Initiative (SLI) with the goal of completing their Sustainable Libraries Certification Program (SLCP). The Sustainable Initiative's Libraries Sustainable Libraries Certification Program will provide the Library with guidance to increase our commitment to sustainability defined as environmentally sound, economically feasible and socially equitable practices.

The Library is asking that you continue to support our mission to provide you with the excellent library service you expect and deserve. The Library Board and staff have collaborated to create a proposed budget that will continue to offer you the highest level of service possible at a reasonable cost. We are pleased to report that the proposed budget increase is below this year's tax cap. 4. Registered with the Suffolk County Board of Elections or the Board of Registration of the Bay Shore Union Free School District.
Registration is required if a person has not voted within four years in a general, school or library election. Voting status may be confirmed by calling the District Clerk at 631-968-1117.


FIRESIDE BOOK DISCUSSION


