In "The Mourning After," Dr. Durante recalls how he reacted to the news of Liz's death, the grief that ensued, and how he recovered and forgave the man who killed his daughter. He also highlights his decision to continue Liz's philanthropic work and created Project Liz-The Mountain Pygmy Project in Uganda to honor her.
